FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the Office of the Attorney General, Office of the Governor, and the State Auditor's Office assume the proposal would have no fiscal impact on their agencies.

Officials from the **Office of State Courts Administrator** assume the proposed legislation would have no fiscal impact on the courts.

Officials from the **Office of the Secretary of State (SOS)** assume statewide newspaper publication of state statutes cost approximately \$1,752 per column inch, based on an estimate provided by the Missouri Press Service. SOS assumes there would be three printings, as required by the state Constitution and state statutes. SOS estimates the total number of inches for this amendment to be 10 inches, which includes the title header and certification paragraph. SOS estimates the total cost of the proposal to be \$52,560 (\$1,752 x 3 x 10). This cost would be incurred in FY 07.

SOS officials state if a special election is called for this purpose rather than being voted on at a general election, the cost of the special election has been estimated to be \$1.2 million based on the cost of the past two such elections.

ASSUMPTION (continued)

Oversight assumes the constitutional amendment would be put before Missouri voters in conjunction with the November 2006 general election. **Oversight** assumes any cost incurred by local elections officials would be absorbed within existing resources because the proposal would be on the ballot in conjunction with the general election.
