FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials of the **Office of the Secretary of State** assume no fiscal impact to their office.

Officials of the **Department of Revenue** stated that this proposal will have minimal fiscal impact, and assume the increase in Nondriver license applicants will be handled using existing resources.

Jefferson County - Director of Administration assume no fiscal impact.

Officials of the **Kansas City Board of Election Commission** assume this proposal would have administrative impact. Officials assume the proposal imposes an extra step or duty on their registrars.

Oversight sent response request to the Election Commissions of St. Louis City, St. Louis County, Jackson County and other election authorities, however, there has been no response.

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.


DESCRIPTION

This bill requires a person registering to vote to present a valid Missouri nondriver's license or passport. A valid Missouri driver's license will continue to be allowed, but birth certificates, tribal documents, and other forms of personal identification will no longer be acceptable for the purpose of voter registration.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
