FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Public Safety - Director's Office** and the **Missouri Highway Patrol** each assume the proposal would not have a fiscal impact on their respective agencies.

In response to a similar proposal from this year (SB 896), officials from the **Department of Transportation** assumed the proposal would not fiscally impact their agency.

Officials from the **Department of Revenue (DOR)** state this proposal would have minimal impact to their agency. There will be programming requirements to the Missouri Electronic Driver License (MEDL) to allow for the parent signature to include additional hours of training; however, this will be absorbed internally. The driver guide will be changed accordingly upon re-printing.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

DESCRIPTION

This proposal requires, beginning January 1, 2007, parents or legal guardians of applicants for a temporary instruction permit to provide 40 hours of behind-the-wheel driving instruction. A minimum of 10 hours must occur during the nighttime hours. Currently, only 20 hours of behind-the-wheel driving instruction is required.

For the first six months after issuance of an intermediate driver's license, the driver cannot operate a vehicle with more than one passenger younger than 19 years of age who is not a member of the driver's immediate family. After the first six-month time period has passed, the driver must not operate a vehicle with more than three passengers younger than 19 years of age who are not members of the driver's immediate family.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
