FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Corrections (DOC)** assume passage of this proposed legislation would ultimately result in savings for DOC.

The initial purchase of equipment and installation at hearing sites throughout the state would be approximately \$49,770 the first year of implementation (FY07). However, this would be offset by approximately the same dollar amount saved from costs of motels, meals and mileage for staff who no longer have to travel to attend hearings. This is indicated by net \$0 in FY07.

The second and subsequent years (FY08 and on) would show the same savings of approximately \$49,770 and this would be offset for ongoing operating costs of approximately \$32,616 for the equipment, resulting in the net savings of approximately \$17,155 per year. This is only an approximation, as inflation, etc. has not been factored in.
