## **ASSUMPTION**

Officials from the **Department of Natural Resources** assume they would not anticipate any direct fiscal impact as a result of this proposal. Future budgets require line item appropriation authority to reimburse the organization with whom the department has a cooperative agreement.

## FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

#### **DESCRIPTION**

This bill authorizes the Director of the Department of Natural Resources to enter into cooperative agreements with private, not-for-profit organizations to reimburse the department for the actual costs of providing state park facility space and incidental staff support. The agreement must also clearly demonstrate the fiscal, interpretive, educational, and facility enhancement benefits to the state.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
