FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

The proposal may impact small business pharmacies is they pay the license fees for intern pharmacists.

DESCRIPTION

This proposal removes the one-year limitation on an intern pharmacist license and the authority of the Board of Pharmacy to promulgate rules restricting the practice of intern pharmacists.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
