#### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### **ASSUMPTION**

Officials from the **Department of Economic Development - Division of Professional Registration** state having reviewed the proposed legislation and having sought the conclusion of the appropriate board(s), they are of the opinion the proposal, in its present form, has no fiscal impact on their organization.

Officials from the **Office of Secretary of State (SOS)** state the fiscal impact for this proposal to the SOS for administrative rules is less than \$1,500. The SOS does not expect additional funding would be required to meet these costs. However, the SOS recognizes that many such bills may be passed by the General Assembly in a given year and that collectively the costs may be in excess of what the office can sustain with its core budget. Therefore, the SOS reserves the right to request funding for the cost of supporting administrative rules requirements should the need arise based on a review of the finally approved bills signed by the Governor.

Officials from the **Department of Health and Senior Services (DOH)** state approximately 30% of the clock hours (training hours) offered in Missouri are "national" providers that already have the National Association of Boards of Examiners for Nursing Home Administrators approval. The DOH estimates these providers will no longer seek Missouri approval, causing a 30% reduction in the fees collected. The average total fees collected from single-offering providers for FY 04, FY 05, including projections for FY 06 is \$5,850. Therefore, a reduction in general

revenue is expected. The DOH estimates a reduction of \$1,462 (10 months) for FY 07; \$1,755 for FY 08; and \$1,755 for FY 09 (\$5,850 X 30%) as a result of this proposal.

**Oversight** assumes the DOH could absorb the minimal loss in fees collected as a result of this proposal.

## FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

#### DESCRIPTION

This proposal allows continuing education for nursing home administrators to be approved through the Missouri Board of Nursing Home Administrators or the National Association of Boards of Examiners for Nursing Home Administrators. Currently, continuing education can only be approved by the state board.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
