DESCRIPTION

This proposal would limit interested investment and bond counsel firms' contributions to any campaign in support of a general obligation bond election. An investment firm offering municipal bond underwriting of financial advisory services, or law firm offering bond counsel services, or any person having an interest in such firms would be required to limit their contributions in a campaign in support of a general obligation bond election to an in-kind nature consisting of organization suggestions, promotional materials development, preparation of suggested election strategies, attendance at public forums to answer questions regarding the financing and legal issues involved, and other activities that do not involve any direct financial contribution.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
