#### ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Office of State Courts Administrator** and the **Office of Attorney General** assume this proposal would not fiscally impact their agencies.

Officials from the **Department of Social Services - Division of Medical Services (DMS)** state Missouri Medicaid does not cover experimental treatment, tests, or drugs. Therefore, DMS states this proposal would not fiscally impact their agency.

Officials from the **Department of Health and Senior Services (DOH)** assume this proposal would not fiscally impact their agency. DOH assumes if a fiscal impact were to result, funds to support the program would be sought through the appropriation process.

DESCRIPTION


This proposal specifies that informed consent is not required for research programs or experimental medical procedures for patients subject to a life-threatening emergency when conducted in accordance with certain federal regulations.

The bill contains an emergency clause.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
