FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Higher Education** (DHE) assume this proposal would not impact their organization. They assume impact on the colleges and universities is unknown. In an effort to prohibit illegal aliens from gaining entry into higher education institutions, this proposal may result in institutions implementing new monitoring and admissions requirements. The costs of any such new procedures are unknown.

Officials from the **University of Missouri** assume the university would incur no additional costs as a result of the passage of this proposal.

Officials from **Truman State University** stated they are not able to determine the fiscal impact of this proposal on their organization.

Officials from the **Lincoln University** assume there could be a modest fiscal impact to monitor that no aliens unlawfully present in the United states are admitted.

ASSUMPTION (continued)

Officials from **St. Louis Community College, Metropolitan Community College, and Linn State Technical College** assume this proposal would have no significant fiscal impact on their organizations.

Oversight assumes this proposal would have no significant fiscal impact on state or local government.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

DESCRIPTION

This proposal would prohibit aliens unlawfully present in the United States from being admitted to public institutions of higher education in this state. Prior to approval of any appropriations by the General Assembly, each public institution of higher education would be required to certify to the Education Appropriations Committee of the House of Representatives and the Appropriations Committee of the Senate that it has not knowingly admitted any aliens unlawfully present in the United States in the preceding year.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
