FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE)** state this proposed legislation will have no fiscal impact on their agency or on local school districts. The fund established in the proposal would be administered by the Department of Higher Education at the direction of the Coordinating Board for Higher Education. The only involvement by DESE appears to be through coordinated effort by the state board and the coordinating board to establish criteria defining "eligible noncertified instructional employee".

Officials from the **Department of Higher Education (DHE)** state that since the number of individuals that may choose to accept this grant is unknown, the fiscal impact on their agency is also unknown. DHE assumes it will need an FTE at the research associate level or some portion of one to administer this program. The FTE need ultimately required will depend on the volume of the applicants.

Oversight assumes the program is subject to appropriation and if additional resources are needed funds to support the program would be sought through the appropriations process.

Officials from the Office of State Treasurer state this proposed legislation will have no fiscal

impact on their agency.

Officials from the **Office of the Secretary of State (SOS)** assume many bills considered by the General Assembly include provisions allowing or requiring agencies to submit rules and regulations to implement the act. The SOS is provided with core funding to handle a certain amount of normal activity resulting from each year's legislative session. The fiscal impact for this proposal for Administrative Rules is less than \$1,500. The SOS recognizes this is a small amount and does not expect additional funding would be required to meet these costs. However, SOS also recognizes that many such bills may be passed in a given year and that collectively the costs may be in excess of what the SOS can sustain with their core budget. Any additional required funding would be handled through the budget process.

Officials from the Kansas City Metropolitan Community College, Moberly Area Community College, University of Missouri, and Lincoln University stated this proposal would have no fiscal impact on their institutions.

Officials from the **Poplar Bluff** and **Francis Howell School Districts** stated this proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective school districts.

DESCRIPTION

This proposed legislation establishes the Missouri Teacher Certification Incentive Program to assist noncertified instructional employees of school districts who have been accepted into college programs leading to teacher certification. The State Board of Education and the Coordinating Board for Higher Education will determine eligibility criteria. For the initial three years of the grant program, the maximum award will be \$1,000. For the fourth and subsequent years, the coordinating board will determine the maximum amount. Each individual receiving a grant will enter into a contract with the coordinating board.

The Missouri Teacher Certification Incentive Fund is created and will be administered by the Department of Higher Education. The fund will consist of moneys appropriated by the General Assembly and any gifts, grants, or bequests from federal, private, or other sources for the purpose of assisting noncertified instructional employees in their education.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
