#### **FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business**

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

### DESCRIPTION

This bill prohibits the Governor from using his or her emergency powers to confiscate firearms or revoke a permit to carry any firearm. The existence of a state of emergency will not affect the constitutional and statutory provisions governing the ownership and use of firearms.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
