FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

DESCRIPTION

This proposal specifies that employees designated as peace officers by the Director of the Division of Alcohol and Tobacco Control within the Department of Public Safety will have the power and authority to make arrests, searches, and seizures for any criminal offense witnessed during an investigation or in connection with any offense when acting at the request of the sheriff of any county or the chief of police of any municipality, or their designated representatives, or other state law enforcement agency. When making an arrest, search, or seizure, the peace officer will notify the sheriff or police department prior to making an arrest, or when there are life-threatening circumstances, immediately after making an arrest.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
