FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Agriculture** assume no fiscal impact to their agency.

Officials from the **Secretary of State's Office** assume based on current content and distribution of the School Information Packet as published, the Secretary of State's Office would revise the materials of the packet to include the newly designated state symbol. The estimated cost to revise the packet for the approximately 100,000 packets distributed each fiscal year is \$500. At this point they will have to redesign the symbols page to accommodate the ever increasing number of state symbols we have.

Based on the current content and layout of the state symbols section of the Official Manual, the Secretary of State's Office would revise this section to include a photo of the symbol and may result in additional page(s) to the book. The estimated cost of revising this section of the Official Manual would be \$0.03 per book. Additionally, the office would incur the cost of payment to an artist for a rendition of the new symbol. Based on historical costs, this is approximately \$100 per symbol.

Oversight assumes the SOS could absorb the costs of printing and distributing regulations related to this proposal. If multiple bills pass which require the printing and distribution of regulations at substantial costs, the SOS could request funding through the appropriation process

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.


DESCRIPTION
