#### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### **ASSUMPTION**

Officials from the Office of State Courts Administrator, Office of the Governor, Missouri Senate, and Office of State Treasurer assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organizations.

Officials from the **Department of Economic Development - Division of Professional Registration** state having reviewed the proposed legislation and having sought the conclusion of the appropriate board(s), they are of the opinion the proposal, in its present form, has no fiscal impact on their organization.

Officials from the **Office of Attorney General (AGO)** state the proposal will reduce four sets of boards into two. The AGO assumes that because of the changes in this proposal, its staffing requirements would either stay the same or may decrease over time. Therefore, the AGO assumes this proposal creates no fiscal impact.

Officials from the **Office of Secretary of State (SOS)** state the proposal eliminates the Committee for Professional Counselors and the State Committee for Family and Marital Therapists and combines their functions into the Board of Counselors and Therapists. The Board of Counselors and Therapists shall promulgate rules to carry out the provisions of this proposal. These rules would be published in both the Missouri Register and Code of State Regulations.

### <u>ASSUMPTION</u> (continued)

These rules may require as many as 36 pages in the Code of State Regulations and 54 pages in the Missouri Register because of cost statements and fiscal notes, etc. that are not repeated in the Code. The estimated cost of a page in the Missouri Register is \$23. The estimated cost of a page in the Code of State Regulations is \$27. The SOS estimates a total cost of \$2,214 [(54 pgs. X \$23) + (36 pgs. X \$27)]. These costs are estimates and depend on the number of rules printed, rescinded, and amended.

**Oversight** assumes the SOS could absorb the costs of printing and distributing regulations related to this proposal. If multiple bills pass which require the printing and distribution of regulations at substantial costs, the SOS could request funding through the appropriation process. Any decisions to raise fees to defray costs would likely be made in subsequent fiscal years.

#### FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

#### **DESCRIPTION**

This proposal abolishes the Committee for Professional Counselors and the State Committee of Marital and Family Therapists and combines the two committees to become the Board of Counselors and Therapists. The Board of Counselors and Therapists Fund is created for the deposit of all moneys collected by the board.

The proposal also allows professional counselors licensed in other states to apply for licensure in Missouri without examination if the applicant has had no disciplinary action taken against his or her license in the past five years and has met all eligibility criteria established by the American Association of State Counseling Boards or its successor organization.
