FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

DESCRIPTION

The proposed legislation requires a court, upon a finding that a former spouse is cohabitating or has cohabitated with another person in a relationship of a romantic nature, to terminate alimony and maintenance payments to the former spouse. The proposal also defines "cohabitation" as the act of two adults dwelling together continuously and habitually for at least 90 days in a romantic relationship, even if the relationship is not solemnized by marriage. Termination of spousal alimony or maintenance will not relieve the former spouse of any required child support payments.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
