### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### **ASSUMPTION**

Officials from the **Department of Public Safety - Office of the Director** and **Missouri State Highway Patrol** state this proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective agencies.

Officials from the **Department of Elementary and Secondary Education** assume a cost of \$495 per child safety alarm system and a total of 11,035 busses to be equipped with the alarm system for a total cost of \$5,907,825.

**Oversight** assumes, based on inquiry of a company that distributes the alarm systems, that discounts of up to 12% are available for volume purchases. **Oversight** assumes, for fiscal note purposes, that the total cost would be an amount less than \$5,907,925.

#### FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

#### **DESCRIPTION**

Beginning with the 2008-2009 school year, this proposed legislation requires every school bus to be equipped with a child safety alarm system.

School bus drivers will be required to activate the child safety alarm system when loading or unloading students on a street or highway.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
