FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Corrections (DOC)** assume parole intervention fees collected from offenders would be lost due to passage of this proposal. The annual amount per offender is \$360. There are over 15,000 parolees and although the collection rate isn't 100%, the potential exists for a substantial fiscal impact.

In summary, the potential fiscal impact for the DOC is unknown, but expected to easily exceed \$100,000 per annum.
