AN ACT

To amend chapter 160, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to the founding documents protection act.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 160, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new section, to be 2 known as section 160.745, to read as follows:

160.745. 1. This act shall be known as "The Founding Documents Protection Act".

2 **2.** No teacher, administrator, or school board in any public school district in this

3 state shall be prohibited from reading or posting in a public school building, classroom, or

- 4 at a school event any excerpts or portions of the following:
 - (1) The preamble to the Missouri Constitution;
- 6 (2) The Declaration of Independence;
- 7 (3) The Constitution of the United States of America;
- 8 (4) The Mayflower Compact;
- 9 (5) The national motto;
- 10 (6) The national anthem;
- 11 (7) The Pledge of Allegiance;

EXPLANATION — Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted from the law. Matter in **bold-face** type in the above bill is proposed language.

12 (8) The writings, speeches, documents, and proclamations of the founding fathers

(9) The writings, speeches, and documents relating to civil rights leaders of theUnited States of America;

(12) Acts of the Congress of the United States of America, including the published
