AN ACT

To repeal sections 301.445, 301.447, 301.451, 301.456, 301.457, 301.464, 301.465, 301.3054, 301.3085, 301.3090, 301.3116, and 301.4000, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof thirteen new sections relating to special license plates for military personnel.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Sections 301.445, 301.447, 301.451, 301.456, 301.457, 301.464, 301.465, 301.3054, 301.3085, 301.3090, 301.3116, and 301.4000, RSMo, are repealed and thirteen new 2 3 sections enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as sections 301.445, 301.447, 301.451, 301.456, 4 301.457, 301.464, 301.465, 301.3030, 301.3054, 301.3085, 301.3090, 301.3116, and 301.4000, 5 to read as follows: 301.445. Any person who has been awarded the combat infantry badge may apply for special motor vehicle license plates for any vehicle such person owns, either solely or jointly, for 2 3 issuance either to passenger motor vehicles subject to the registration fees provided in section 301.055, or for a nonlocal property-carrying commercial motor vehicle licensed for a gross 4 weight not in excess of twelve thousand pounds as provided in section 301.057. Any such 5 6 person shall make application for the special license plates on a form provided by the director 7 of revenue and furnish such proof as a recipient of the combat infantry badge as the director may 8 require. The director shall then issue license plates bearing the words "COMBAT INFANTRYMAN" in place of the words "SHOW-ME STATE" in a form prescribed by the 9

10 director, except that such license plates shall be made with fully reflective material, shall have

a white background with a blue and red configuration at the discretion of the director, shall be 11 12 clearly visible at night, and shall be aesthetically attractive, as prescribed by section 301.130. 13 Such plates shall also bear an image of the combat infantry badge. There shall be an additional 14 fee charged for each set of special combat infantry badge license plates issued equal to the fee charged for personalized license plates in section 301.144. [No more than one set of combat 15 16 infantry badge license plates shall be issued to a qualified applicant.] There shall be no limit 17 on the number of license plates any person qualified under this section may obtain so long 18 as each set of license plates issued under this section is issued for vehicles owned solely or 19 jointly by such person. License plates issued pursuant to the provisions of this section shall not 20 be transferable to any other person except that any registered co-owner of the motor vehicle shall be entitled to operate the motor vehicle with such plates for the duration of the year licensed in 21 22 the event of the death of the qualified person. 301.447. 1. Any member of the United States Military Service who was stationed on or within three miles of the Hawaiian Island of Oahu on December 7, 1941, during the enemy attack 2 3 on Pearl Harbor and other related military installations may apply for special motor vehicle license plates for one vehicle he owns, either solely or jointly, as provided in this section. Any 4

5 such person shall make application for the special license plates on a form provided by the 6 director of revenue and pay an additional fee equal to the fee charged for personalized license 7 plates in section 301.144 for the issuance of the license plates provided for herein. Applications 8 for license plates issued under this section shall be accompanied by such proof of eligibility as

9 the director may require.

10 2. Notwithstanding the provisions of section 301.130, each such license plate shall be 11 embossed with the words "PEARL HARBOR SURVIVOR" at the bottom of the plate in the 12 form prescribed by the advisory committee established in section 301.129. Such license plates 13 shall be made with fully reflective material, shall have a white background with a blue and red configuration at the discretion of the advisory committee established in section 301.129, shall 14 be clearly visible at night, and shall be aesthetically attractive, as prescribed by section 301.130. 15 16 Such plates shall be available for issuance either to passenger motor vehicles subject to the registration fees provided in section 301.055, or to nonlocal property-carrying commercial motor 17 18 vehicles licensed for a gross weight of six thousand pounds up through and including twelve 19 thousand pounds as provided in section 301.057.

20 3. [No more than one set of Pearl Harbor survivor plates shall be issued to a qualified 21 applicant.] There shall be no limit on the number of license plates any person qualified 22 under this section may obtain so long as each set of license plates issued under this section 23 is issued for vehicles owned solely or jointly by such person. License plates issued under the 24 provisions of this section shall not be transferable to any other person except as provided herein.

Any registered co-owner of a motor vehicle will be entitled to operate the motor vehicle for the duration of the year licensed in the event of the death of the qualified applicant. Pearl Harbor survivor plates issued under the provisions of this section shall be transferable only to a widow

28 or widower of a Pearl Harbor survivor.

301.451. Any person who has been awarded the purple heart medal may apply for special motor vehicle license plates for any vehicle he owns, either solely or jointly, other than 2 3 commercial vehicles weighing over twelve thousand pounds. Any such person shall make 4 application for the special license plates on a form provided by the director of revenue and 5 furnish such proof as a recipient of the purple heart medal as the director may require. The director shall then issue license plates bearing letters or numbers or a combination thereof, with 6 the words "PURPLE HEART" in place of the words "SHOW-ME STATE" in a form prescribed 7 8 by the advisory committee established in section 301.129. Such license plates shall be made with fully reflective material with a common color scheme and design, shall be clearly visible 9 10 at night, and shall be aesthetically attractive, as prescribed by section 301.130. There shall be an additional fee charged for each set of special purple heart license plates issued equal to the 11 12 fee charged for personalized license plates, but the additional fee shall only have to be paid once by the qualified applicant at the time of initial application. [No more than two sets of purple 13 14 heart license plates shall be issued to a qualified applicant.] There shall be no limit on the number of license plates any person qualified under this section may obtain so long as each 15 16 set of license plates issued under this section is issued for vehicles owned solely or jointly 17 by such person. License plates issued under the provisions of this section shall not be transferable to any other person except that any registered co-owner of the motor vehicle shall 18 19 be entitled to operate the motor vehicle for the duration of the year licensed in the event of the 20 death of the qualified person.

301.456. Any person who has been awarded the military service award known as the "Silver Star" may apply for special motor vehicle license plates for any vehicle such person 2 owns, either solely or jointly, other than an apportioned motor vehicle or a commercial motor 3 4 vehicle licensed in excess of eighteen thousand pounds gross weight. Any such person shall make application for the special license plates on a form provided by the director of revenue and 5 6 furnish such proof as a recipient of the silver star as the director may require. The director shall 7 then issue license plates bearing letters or numbers or a combination thereof as determined by the advisory committee established in section 301.129, with the words "SILVER STAR" in place 8 of the words "SHOW-ME STATE". Such license plates shall be made with fully reflective 9 10 material with a common color scheme and design, shall be clearly visible at night, and shall be 11 aesthetically attractive, as prescribed by section 301.130. Such plates shall also bear an image 12 of the silver star. There shall be an additional fee charged for each set of silver star license plates

issued pursuant to this section equal to the fee charged for personalized license plates. [No more 13 14 than two sets of silver star license plates shall be issued to a qualified applicant.] There shall be no limit on the number of license plates any person qualified under this section may obtain 15 16 so long as each set of license plates issued under this section is issued for vehicles owned solely or jointly by such person. License plates issued under the provisions of this section shall 17 18 not be transferable to any other person except that any registered co-owner of the motor vehicle 19 shall be entitled to operate the motor vehicle with such plates for the duration of the year licensed 20 in the event of the death of the qualified person.

301.457. Any person who served in the Vietnam Conflict and either currently serves in 2 any branch of the United States armed forces or was honorably discharged from such service may apply for special motor vehicle license plates, either solely or jointly, for issuance either for any 3 passenger motor vehicle subject to the registration fees provided in section 301.055 or for a 4 nonlocal property-carrying commercial motor vehicle licensed for a gross weight of nine 5 thousand one pounds to twelve thousand pounds as provided in section 301.057, whether such 6 7 vehicle is owned solely or jointly. Any such person shall make application for the special license plates on a form provided by the director of revenue and furnish such proof of service in the 8 Vietnam Conflict and status as currently serving in a branch of the armed forces of the United 9 10 States or as an honorably discharged veteran as the director may require. Upon presentation of the proof of eligibility and annual payment of the fee required for personalized license plates 11 prescribed by section 301.144, and other fees and documents which may be required by law, the 12 director shall then issue license plates bearing letters or numbers or a combination thereof as 13 determined by the advisory committee established in section 301.129, with the words 14 "VIETNAM VETERAN" in place of the words "SHOW-ME STATE". Such plates shall also 15 16 bear an image of the Vietnam service medal. The plates shall be clearly visible at night and shall 17 be aesthetically attractive, as prescribed by section 301.130. [No more than one set of special 18 license plates shall be issued pursuant to this section to a qualified applicant.] There shall be no 19 limit on the number of license plates any person qualified under this section may obtain so long as each set of license plates issued under this section is issued for vehicles owned 20 21 solely or jointly by such person. License plates issued pursuant to this section shall not be 22 transferable to any other person except that any registered co-owner of the motor vehicle may 23 operate the motor vehicle for the duration of the year licensed in the event of the death of the 24 qualified person.

301.464. Any person who served in the Korean War and was honorably discharged from
such service may apply for special motor vehicle license plates, either solely or jointly, for
issuance for any vehicle the person owns, either solely or jointly, other than an apportioned
motor vehicle or commercial motor vehicle licensed in excess of eighteen thousand pounds. Any

such person shall make application for the special license plates on a form provided by the 5 director of revenue and furnish such proof of service in the Korean War and status as an 6 honorably discharged veteran as the director may require. Upon presentation of the proof of 7 eligibility and annual payment of the fee required for personalized license plates prescribed by 8 9 section 301.144, and other fees and documents which may be required by law, the director shall then issue license plates bearing letters or numbers or a combination thereof as determined by 10 the advisory committee established in section 301.129, with the words "KOREAN WAR 11 12 VETERAN" in place of the words "SHOW-ME STATE". Such plates shall also bear an image 13 of the Korean War service medal. The plates shall be clearly visible at night and shall be 14 aesthetically attractive, as prescribed by section 301.130. [No more than one set of special license plates shall be issued pursuant to this section to a qualified applicant.] There shall be no 15 limit on the number of license plates any person qualified under this section may obtain 16 so long as each set of license plates issued under this section is issued for vehicles owned 17 solely or jointly by such person. License plates issued pursuant to this section shall not be 18 19 transferable to any other person except that any registered co-owner of the motor vehicle may

20 operate the motor vehicle for the duration of the year licensed in the event of the death of the

21 qualified person.

301.465. Any person who served in World War II and was honorably discharged from such service may apply for special motor vehicle license plates, either solely or jointly, for 2 3 issuance either for any passenger motor vehicle subject to the registration fees provided in 4 section 301.055, or for a nonlocal property carrying commercial motor vehicle licensed for a gross weight of nine thousand one pounds to twelve thousand pounds as provided in section 5 6 301.057, whether such vehicle is owned solely or jointly. Any such person shall make 7 application for the special license plates on a form provided by the director of revenue and 8 furnish such proof of service in World War II and status as an honorably discharged veteran as the director may require. Upon presentation of the proof of eligibility and annual payment of the 9 10 fee required for personalized license plates prescribed by section 301.144, and other fees and 11 documents which may be required by law, the director shall then issue license plates bearing letters or numbers or a combination thereof as determined by the advisory committee established 12 13 in section 301.129, with the words "WORLD WAR II VETERAN" in place of the words 14 "SHOW-ME-STATE". Such plates shall also bear an image of the World War II service medal. The plates shall be clearly visible at night and shall be aesthetically attractive, as prescribed by 15 section 301.130. [No more than one set of special license plates shall be issued pursuant to this 16 section to a qualified applicant.] There shall be no limit on the number of license plates any 17 person qualified under this section may obtain so long as each set of license plates issued 18 19 under this section is issued for vehicles owned solely or jointly by such person. License

- 20 plates issued pursuant to this section shall not be transferable to any other person except that any
- 21 registered co-owner of the motor vehicle may operate the motor vehicle for the duration of the
- 22 year licensed in the event of the death of the qualified person.

301.3030. Any special license plates involving military actions or personnel that are authorized after the effective date of this section shall not limit the number of license plates

- 3 any person qualified for such special license plate may obtain so long as each set of license
- 4 plates issued is issued for vehicles owned solely or jointly by the qualified applicant.

301.3054. 1. Any person who served in the active military service in a branch of the armed services of the United States and was honorably discharged from such service may apply for special personalized license plates for any vehicle other than an apportioned motor vehicle or a commercial motor vehicle licensed in excess of eighteen thousand pounds gross weight. Any such person shall make application for the special license plates on a form provided by the director of revenue and furnish such proof of service and status as an honorably discharged veteran as the director may require.

8 2. Upon presentation of proof of eligibility and payment of a fifteen dollar fee in addition 9 to the regular registration fees, and presentation of any documents which may be required by law, the director shall issue to the vehicle owner special personalized license plates with the words 10 11 "U.S. VET" in place of the words "SHOW-ME STATE". Such license plates shall be made with 12 fully reflective material with a common color scheme and design, shall be clearly visible at night, 13 shall have a reflective white background with a blue and red configuration in the area of the plate 14 configuration, and shall be aesthetically attractive, as prescribed by section 301.130. Notwithstanding the provisions of section 301.144, no additional fee shall be charged for the 15 16 personalization of license plates pursuant to this section.

17 3. [No more than one set of special license plates shall be issued pursuant to this section 18 to a qualified applicant.] There shall be no limit on the number of license plates any person qualified under this section may obtain so long as each set of license plates issued under 19 20 this section is issued for vehicles owned solely or jointly by such person. License plates 21 issued pursuant to this section shall not be transferable to any other person except that any 22 registered co-owner of the vehicle may operate the vehicle for the duration of the registration in 23 the event of the death of the qualified person. The director of revenue shall make necessary rules 24 and regulations for the enforcement of this section, and shall design all necessary forms required 25 by this section. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010, RSMo, that is created under the authority delegated in this section shall become effective only if it 26 27 complies with and is subject to all of the provisions of chapter 536, RSMo, and, if applicable, 28 section 536.028, RSMo. This section and chapter 536, RSMo, are nonseverable and if any of 29 the powers vested with the general assembly pursuant to chapter 536, RSMo, to review, to delay

30 the effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently held unconstitutional, then

the grant of rulemaking authority and any rule proposed or adopted after August 28, 2004, shall

32 be invalid and void.

301.3085. Any person who has participated in active duty combat action while serving in the United States Marine Corps or the United States Navy may apply for special motor vehicle 2 license plates for any vehicle such person owns, either solely or jointly, other than an apportioned 3 motor vehicle licensed in excess of eighteen thousand pounds gross weight. Any such person 4 5 shall make application for the special license plates on a form provided by the director of revenue 6 and furnish such proof as a recipient of the combat infantry badge as the director may require. The director shall then issue license plates bearing the words "COMBAT ACTION RIBBON" 7 in place of the words "SHOW-ME STATE" in a form prescribed by the director, except that such 8 license plates shall be made with fully reflective material, shall have a white background with 9 a blue and red configuration at the discretion of the director, shall be clearly visible at night, and 10 11 shall be aesthetically attractive, as prescribed by section 301.130. Such plates shall also bear an image of a blue, yellow, and red ribbon. There shall be an additional fee charged for each set of 12 13 special combat action ribbon license plates issued equal to the fee charged for personalized 14 license plates in section 301.144. [No more than one set of combat action ribbon license plates shall be issued to a qualified applicant.] There shall be no limit on the number of license 15 16 plates any person qualified under this section may obtain so long as each set of license plates issued under this section is issued for vehicles owned solely or jointly by such person. 17 License plates issued pursuant to the provisions of this section shall not be transferable to any 18 19 other person except that any registered co-owner of the motor vehicle shall be entitled to operate 20 the motor vehicle with such plates for the duration of the year licensed in the event of the death 21 of the qualified person.

301.3090. Any person who is serving on active duty or has served in any branch of the United States military, including the reserves or national guard, during any part of Operation 2 Enduring Freedom and has not been dishonorably discharged may receive special motor vehicle 3 license plates for any motor vehicle such person owns, either solely or jointly, other than an 4 apportioned motor vehicle or a commercial motor vehicle licensed in excess of eighteen 5 6 thousand pounds gross weight. Any such person shall make application for the special license 7 plates on a form provided by the director of revenue and furnish such proof of service during Operation Enduring Freedom or proof of status as an honorably discharged veteran as the 8 director may require. Upon presentation of the proof of eligibility and annual payment of the fee 9 required for personalized license plates prescribed by section 301.144, and other fees and 10 documents which may be required by law, the director shall then issue license plates bearing 11 letters or numbers or a combination thereof as determined by the advisory committee established 12

in section 301.129, with the words "OPERATION ENDURING FREEDOM" in place of the 13 words "SHOW-ME STATE". Such plates shall also bear an image of the American flag. The 14 plates shall be clearly visible at night and shall be aesthetically attractive, as prescribed by 15 section 301.130. [No more than one set of special license plates shall be issued pursuant to this 16 section to a qualified applicant.] There shall be no limit on the number of license plates any 17 18 person qualified under this section may obtain so long as each set of license plates issued 19 under this section is issued for vehicles owned solely or jointly by such person. License 20 plates issued pursuant to this section shall not be transferable to any other person except that any 21 registered co-owner of the motor vehicle may operate the motor vehicle for the duration of the 22 year licensed in the event of the death of the qualified person.

301.3116. Any person who is serving or has served in any branch of the United States military, including the reserves or national guard, during any part of Operation Noble Eagle and 2 has not been dishonorably discharged may receive special motor vehicle license plates for any 3 motor vehicle such person owns, either solely or jointly, other than an apportioned motor vehicle 4 or a commercial motor vehicle licensed in excess of eighteen thousand pounds gross weight. 5 Any such person shall make application for the special license plates on a form provided by the 6 director of revenue and furnish such proof of service during Operation Noble Eagle or proof of 7 8 status as an honorably discharged veteran as the director may require. Upon presentation of the 9 proof of eligibility and annual payment of the fee required for personalized license plates 10 prescribed by section 301.144, and other fees and documents which may be required by law, the 11 director shall then issue license plates bearing letters or numbers or a combination thereof as 12 determined by the advisory committee established in section 301.129, with the words 13 "OPERATION NOBLE EAGLE" in place of the words "SHOW-ME STATE". Such plates shall 14 also bear an image of the American flag. The plates shall be clearly visible at night and shall be 15 aesthetically attractive, as prescribed by section 301.130. [No more than one set of special 16 license plates shall be issued pursuant to this section to a qualified applicant.] There shall be no 17 limit on the number of license plates any person qualified under this section may obtain so long as each set of license plates issued under this section is issued for vehicles owned 18 19 solely or jointly by such person. License plates issued pursuant to this section shall not be 20 transferable to any other person except that any registered co-owner of the motor vehicle may 21 operate the motor vehicle for the duration of the year licensed in the event of the death of the 22 qualified person.

301.4000. Any person who served in the active military service in a branch of the armed forces of the United States and was honorably discharged from such service may apply for special motorcycle license plates, either solely or jointly, for issuance for any motorcycle subject to the registration fees provided in section 301.055. Any such person shall make application for

the special license plates on a form provided by the director of revenue and furnish such proof 5 of service and status as an honorably discharged veteran as the director may require. Upon 6 presentation of the proof of eligibility and payment of a fifteen dollar fee in addition to the 7 regulation registration fees, and presentation of other documents which may be required by law, 8 9 the director shall then issue license plates bearing letters or numbers or a combination thereof as determined by the director, with the words "U.S. VET" in place of the words "SHOW-ME 10 STATE". The plates shall be clearly visible at night and shall be aesthetically attractive, as 11 12 prescribed by section 301.130. [No more than one set of special license plates shall be issued 13 pursuant to this section to a qualified applicant.] There shall be no limit on the number of 14 license plates any person qualified under this section may obtain so long as each set of 15 license plates issued under this section is issued for vehicles owned solely or jointly by such **person.** License plates issued pursuant to this section shall not be transferable to any other 16 person except that any registered co-owner of the motorcycle may operate the motorcycle for the 17 18 duration of the year licensed in the event of the death of the qualified person.
