AN ACT

To repeal sections 301.445, 301.447, 301.451, 301.456, 301.457, 301.464, 301.465, 301.3054, 301.3085, 301.3090, 301.3116, and 301.4000, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof fifteen new sections relating to special license plates for military personnel.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Sections 301.445, 301.447, 301.451, 301.456, 301.457, 301.464, 301.465, 301.3054, 301.3085, 301.3090, 301.3116, and 301.4000, RSMo, are repealed and fifteen new sections enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as sections 301.445, 301.447, 301.451, 301.456, 301.457, 301.464, 301.465, 301.3030, 301.3054, 301.3061, 301.3085, 301.3090, 301.3116, 301.3141, and 301.4000, to read as follows:

301.445. Any person who has been awarded the combat infantry badge may apply for special motor vehicle license plates for any vehicle such person owns, either solely or jointly, for issuance either to passenger motor vehicles subject to the registration fees provided in section 301.055, or for a nonlocal property-carrying commercial motor vehicle licensed for a gross weight not in excess of twelve thousand pounds as provided in section 301.057. Any such person shall make application for the special license plates on a form provided by the director of revenue and furnish such proof as a recipient of the combat infantry badge as the director may require. The director shall then issue license plates bearing the words "COMBAT INFANTRYMAN" in place of the words "SHOW-ME STATE" in a form prescribed by the director, except that such license plates shall be made with fully reflective material, shall have a white background

13 with a blue and red configuration at the discretion of the director, shall be clearly
14 visible at night, and shall be aesthetically attractive, as prescribed by section
15 301.130. Such plates shall also bear an image of the combat infantry
16 badge. There shall be an additional fee charged for each set of special combat
17 infantry badge license plates issued equal to the fee charged for personalized
18 license plates in section 301.144. [No more than one set of combat infantry badge
19 license plates shall be issued to a qualified applicant.] There shall be no limit
20 on the number of license plates any person qualified under this section
21 may obtain so long as each set of license plates issued under this
22 section is issued for vehicles owned solely or jointly by such
23 person. License plates issued pursuant to the provisions of this section shall not
24 be transferable to any other person except that any registered co-owner of the
25 motor vehicle shall be entitled to operate the motor vehicle with such plates for
26 the duration of the year licensed in the event of the death of the qualified person.

301.447. 1. Any member of the United States Military Service who was
2 stationed on or within three miles of the Hawaiian Island of Oahu on December
3 7, 1941, during the enemy attack on Pearl Harbor and other related military
4 installations may apply for special motor vehicle license plates for one vehicle he
5 owns, either solely or jointly, as provided in this section. Any such person shall
6 make application for the special license plates on a form provided by the director
7 of revenue and pay an additional fee equal to the fee charged for personalized
8 license plates in section 301.144 for the issuance of the license plates provided for
9 herein. Applications for license plates issued under this section shall be
10 accompanied by such proof of eligibility as the director may require.

11 2. Notwithstanding the provisions of section 301.130, each such license
12 plate shall be embossed with the words "PEARL HARBOR SURVIVOR" at the
13 bottom of the plate in the form prescribed by the advisory committee established
14 in section 301.129. Such license plates shall be made with fully reflective
15 material, shall have a white background with a blue and red configuration at the
16 discretion of the advisory committee established in section 301.129, shall be
17 clearly visible at night, and shall be aesthetically attractive, as prescribed by
18 section 301.130. Such plates shall be available for issuance either to passenger
19 motor vehicles subject to the registration fees provided in section 301.055, or to
20 nonlocal property-carrying commercial motor vehicles licensed for a gross weight
21 of six thousand pounds up through and including twelve thousand pounds as
22 provided in section 301.057.

23 3. [No more than one set of Pearl Harbor survivor plates shall be issued
24 to a qualified applicant.] There shall be no limit on the number of license
25 plates any person qualified under this section may obtain so long as
26 each set of license plates issued under this section is issued for vehicles
27 owned solely or jointly by such person. License plates issued under the
28 provisions of this section shall not be transferable to any other person except as
29 provided herein. Any registered co-owner of a motor vehicle will be entitled to
30 operate the motor vehicle for the duration of the year licensed in the event of the
31 death of the qualified applicant. Pearl Harbor survivor plates issued under the
32 provisions of this section shall be transferable only to a widow or widower of a
33 Pearl Harbor survivor.

 301.451. Any person who has been awarded the purple heart medal may
2 apply for special motor vehicle license plates for any vehicle he owns, either solely
3 or jointly, other than commercial vehicles weighing over twelve thousand
4 pounds. Any such person shall make application for the special license plates on
5 a form provided by the director of revenue and furnish such proof as a recipient
6 of the purple heart medal as the director may require. The director shall then
7 issue license plates bearing letters or numbers or a combination thereof, with the
8 words "PURPLE HEART" in place of the words "SHOW-ME STATE" in a form
9 prescribed by the advisory committee established in section 301.129. Such license
10 plates shall be made with fully reflective material with a common color scheme
11 and design, shall be clearly visible at night, and shall be aesthetically attractive,
12 as prescribed by section 301.130. There shall be an additional fee charged for
13 each set of special purple heart license plates issued equal to the fee charged for
14 personalized license plates, but the additional fee shall only have to be paid once
15 by the qualified applicant at the time of initial application. [No more than two
16 sets of purple heart license plates shall be issued to a qualified applicant.] There
17 shall be no limit on the number of license plates any person qualified
18 under this section may obtain so long as each set of license plates
19 issued under this section is issued for vehicles owned solely or jointly
20 by such person. License plates issued under the provisions of this section shall
21 not be transferable to any other person except that any registered co-owner of the
22 motor vehicle shall be entitled to operate the motor vehicle for the duration of the
23 year licensed in the event of the death of the qualified person.

 301.456. Any person who has been awarded the military service award
2 known as the "Silver Star" may apply for special motor vehicle license plates for

3 any vehicle such person owns, either solely or jointly, other than an apportioned
4 motor vehicle or a commercial motor vehicle licensed in excess of eighteen
5 thousand pounds gross weight. Any such person shall make application for the
6 special license plates on a form provided by the director of revenue and furnish
7 such proof as a recipient of the silver star as the director may require. The
8 director shall then issue license plates bearing letters or numbers or a
9 combination thereof as determined by the advisory committee established in
10 section 301.129, with the words "SILVER STAR" in place of the words
11 "SHOW-ME STATE". Such license plates shall be made with fully reflective
12 material with a common color scheme and design, shall be clearly visible at night,
13 and shall be aesthetically attractive, as prescribed by section 301.130. Such
14 plates shall also bear an image of the silver star. There shall be an additional
15 fee charged for each set of silver star license plates issued pursuant to this
16 section equal to the fee charged for personalized license plates. [No more than
17 two sets of silver star license plates shall be issued to a qualified applicant.]
18 There shall be no limit on the number of license plates any person
19 qualified under this section may obtain so long as each set of license
20 plates issued under this section is issued for vehicles owned solely or
21 jointly by such person. License plates issued under the provisions of this
22 section shall not be transferable to any other person except that any registered
23 co-owner of the motor vehicle shall be entitled to operate the motor vehicle with
24 such plates for the duration of the year licensed in the event of the death of the
25 qualified person.

301.457. Any person who served in the Vietnam Conflict and either
2 currently serves in any branch of the United States armed forces or was
3 honorably discharged from such service may apply for special motor vehicle
4 license plates, either solely or jointly, for issuance either for any passenger motor
5 vehicle subject to the registration fees provided in section 301.055 or for a
6 nonlocal property-carrying commercial motor vehicle licensed for a gross weight
7 of nine thousand one pounds to twelve thousand pounds as provided in section
8 301.057, whether such vehicle is owned solely or jointly. Any such person shall
9 make application for the special license plates on a form provided by the director
10 of revenue and furnish such proof of service in the Vietnam Conflict and status
11 as currently serving in a branch of the armed forces of the United States or as an
12 honorably discharged veteran as the director may require. Upon presentation of
13 the proof of eligibility and annual payment of the fee required for personalized

14 license plates prescribed by section 301.144, and other fees and documents which
15 may be required by law, the director shall then issue license plates bearing
16 letters or numbers or a combination thereof as determined by the advisory
17 committee established in section 301.129, with the words "VIETNAM VETERAN"
18 in place of the words "SHOW-ME STATE". Such plates shall also bear an image
19 of the Vietnam service medal. The plates shall be clearly visible at night and
20 shall be aesthetically attractive, as prescribed by section 301.130. [No more than
21 one set of special license plates shall be issued pursuant to this section to a
22 qualified applicant.] There shall be no limit on the number of license
23 plates any person qualified under this section may obtain so long as
24 each set of license plates issued under this section is issued for vehicles
25 owned solely or jointly by such person. License plates issued pursuant to
26 this section shall not be transferable to any other person except that any
27 registered co-owner of the motor vehicle may operate the motor vehicle for the
28 duration of the year licensed in the event of the death of the qualified person.

301.464. Any person who served in the Korean War and was honorably
2 discharged from such service may apply for special motor vehicle license plates,
3 either solely or jointly, for issuance for any vehicle the person owns, either solely
4 or jointly, other than an apportioned motor vehicle or commercial motor vehicle
5 licensed in excess of eighteen thousand pounds. Any such person shall make
6 application for the special license plates on a form provided by the director of
7 revenue and furnish such proof of service in the Korean War and status as an
8 honorably discharged veteran as the director may require. Upon presentation of
9 the proof of eligibility and annual payment of the fee required for personalized
10 license plates prescribed by section 301.144, and other fees and documents which
11 may be required by law, the director shall then issue license plates bearing
12 letters or numbers or a combination thereof as determined by the advisory
13 committee established in section 301.129, with the words "KOREAN WAR
14 VETERAN" in place of the words "SHOW-ME STATE". Such plates shall also
15 bear an image of the Korean War service medal. The plates shall be clearly
16 visible at night and shall be aesthetically attractive, as prescribed by section
17 301.130. [No more than one set of special license plates shall be issued pursuant
18 to this section to a qualified applicant.] There shall be no limit on the
19 number of license plates any person qualified under this section may
20 obtain so long as each set of license plates issued under this section is
21 issued for vehicles owned solely or jointly by such person. License plates

22 issued pursuant to this section shall not be transferable to any other person
23 except that any registered co-owner of the motor vehicle may operate the motor
24 vehicle for the duration of the year licensed in the event of the death of the
25 qualified person.

301.465. Any person who served in World War II and was honorably
2 discharged from such service may apply for special motor vehicle license plates,
3 either solely or jointly, for issuance either for any passenger motor vehicle subject
4 to the registration fees provided in section 301.055, or for a nonlocal property
5 carrying commercial motor vehicle licensed for a gross weight of nine thousand
6 one pounds to twelve thousand pounds as provided in section 301.057, whether
7 such vehicle is owned solely or jointly. Any such person shall make application
8 for the special license plates on a form provided by the director of revenue and
9 furnish such proof of service in World War II and status as an honorably
10 discharged veteran as the director may require. Upon presentation of the proof
11 of eligibility and annual payment of the fee required for personalized license
12 plates prescribed by section 301.144, and other fees and documents which may
13 be required by law, the director shall then issue license plates bearing letters or
14 numbers or a combination thereof as determined by the advisory committee
15 established in section 301.129, with the words "WORLD WAR II VETERAN" in
16 place of the words "SHOW-ME-STATE". Such plates shall also bear an image of
17 the World War II service medal. The plates shall be clearly visible at night and
18 shall be aesthetically attractive, as prescribed by section 301.130. [No more than
19 one set of special license plates shall be issued pursuant to this section to a
20 qualified applicant.] There shall be no limit on the number of license
21 plates any person qualified under this section may obtain so long as
22 each set of license plates issued under this section is issued for vehicles
23 owned solely or jointly by such person. License plates issued pursuant to
24 this section shall not be transferable to any other person except that any
25 registered co-owner of the motor vehicle may operate the motor vehicle for the
26 duration of the year licensed in the event of the death of the qualified person.

301.3030. Any special license plates involving military actions or
2 personnel that are authorized after the effective date of this section
3 shall not limit the number of license plates any person qualified for
4 such special license plate may obtain so long as each set of license
5 plates issued is issued for vehicles owned solely or jointly by the
6 qualified applicant.

301.3054. 1. Any person who served in the active military service in a
2 branch of the armed services of the United States and was honorably discharged
3 from such service may apply for special personalized license plates for any vehicle
4 other than an apportioned motor vehicle or a commercial motor vehicle licensed
5 in excess of eighteen thousand pounds gross weight. Any such person shall make
6 application for the special license plates on a form provided by the director of
7 revenue and furnish such proof of service and status as an honorably discharged
8 veteran as the director may require.

9 2. Upon presentation of proof of eligibility and payment of a fifteen dollar
10 fee in addition to the regular registration fees, and presentation of any documents
11 which may be required by law, the director shall issue to the vehicle owner
12 special personalized license plates with the words "U.S. VET" in place of the
13 words "SHOW-ME STATE". Such license plates shall be made with fully
14 reflective material with a common color scheme and design, shall be clearly
15 visible at night, shall have a reflective white background with a blue and red
16 configuration in the area of the plate configuration, and shall be aesthetically
17 attractive, as prescribed by section 301.130. Notwithstanding the provisions of
18 section 301.144, no additional fee shall be charged for the personalization of
19 license plates pursuant to this section.

20 3. [No more than one set of special license plates shall be issued pursuant
21 to this section to a qualified applicant.] There shall be no limit on the
22 number of license plates any person qualified under this section may
23 obtain so long as each set of license plates issued under this section is
24 issued for vehicles owned solely or jointly by such person. License plates
25 issued pursuant to this section shall not be transferable to any other person
26 except that any registered co-owner of the vehicle may operate the vehicle for the
27 duration of the registration in the event of the death of the qualified person. The
28 director of revenue shall make necessary rules and regulations for the
29 enforcement of this section, and shall design all necessary forms required by this
30 section. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010,
31 RSMo, that is created under the authority delegated in this section shall become
32 effective only if it complies with and is subject to all of the provisions of chapter
33 536, RSMo, and, if applicable, section 536.028, RSMo. This section and chapter
34 536, RSMo, are nonseverable and if any of the powers vested with the general
35 assembly pursuant to chapter 536, RSMo, to review, to delay the effective date,
36 or to disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently held unconstitutional, then

37 the grant of rulemaking authority and any rule proposed or adopted after August
38 28, 2004, shall be invalid and void.

301.3061. 1. Any person eligible for membership in the Disabled
2 American Veterans and who possess a valid membership card issued by
3 the Disabled American Veterans may apply for Missouri Disabled
4 American Veterans license plates for any motor vehicle the person
5 owns, either solely or jointly, other than an apportioned motor vehicle
6 or a commercial motor vehicle licensed in excess of eighteen thousand
7 pounds gross weight. The Missouri Disabled American Veterans hereby
8 authorizes the use of its official emblem to be affixed on multiyear
9 personalized license plates as provided in this section.

10 2. Upon presentation of a current photo identification, the
11 person's valid membership card issued by the Disabled American
12 Veterans, and payment of a fifteen dollar fee in addition to the regular
13 registration fees and presentation of other documents which may be
14 required by law, the department of revenue shall issue a personalized
15 license plate to the vehicle owner, which shall bear the emblem of the
16 Disabled American Veterans, an emblem consisting exclusively of a red
17 letter "D", followed by a white letter "A" and a blue letter "V" in modified
18 block letters, with each letter having a black shaded edging, and shall
19 engrave the words "WARTIME DISABLED" in red letters centered near
20 the bottom of the plate. Such license plates shall be made with fully
21 reflective material with a common color scheme and design, shall be
22 clearly visible at night, and shall be aesthetically attractive, as
23 prescribed by section 301.130. A fee for the issuance of personalized
24 license plates issued under section 301.144 shall not be required for
25 plates issued under this section.

26 3. Any person who applies for a Disabled American Veterans
27 license plate under this section to be used on a vehicle commonly
28 known and referred to as a pickup truck may be issued a Disabled
29 American Veterans license plate with the designation "beyond local"
30 indicated in the upper right corner of the plate.

31 4. The director shall promulgate rules to implement the
32 provisions of this section. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is
33 defined in section 536.010, RSMo, that is created under the authority
34 delegated in this section shall become effective only if it complies with
35 and is subject to all of the provisions of chapter 536, RSMo, and, if

36 applicable, section 536.028, RSMo. This section and chapter 536, RSMo,
37 are nonseverable and if any of the powers vested with the general
38 assembly pursuant to chapter 536, RSMo, to review, to delay the
39 effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently held
40 unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking authority and any rule
41 proposed or adopted after August 28, 2006, shall be invalid and void.

301.3085. Any person who has participated in active duty combat action
2 while serving in the United States Marine Corps or the United States Navy may
3 apply for special motor vehicle license plates for any vehicle such person owns,
4 either solely or jointly, other than an apportioned motor vehicle licensed in excess
5 of eighteen thousand pounds gross weight. Any such person shall make
6 application for the special license plates on a form provided by the director of
7 revenue and furnish such proof as a recipient of the combat infantry badge as the
8 director may require. The director shall then issue license plates bearing the
9 words "COMBAT ACTION RIBBON" in place of the words "SHOW-ME STATE"
10 in a form prescribed by the director, except that such license plates shall be made
11 with fully reflective material, shall have a white background with a blue and red
12 configuration at the discretion of the director, shall be clearly visible at night,
13 and shall be aesthetically attractive, as prescribed by section 301.130. Such
14 plates shall also bear an image of a blue, yellow, and red ribbon. There shall be
15 an additional fee charged for each set of special combat action ribbon license
16 plates issued equal to the fee charged for personalized license plates in section
17 301.144. [No more than one set of combat action ribbon license plates shall be
18 issued to a qualified applicant.] There shall be no limit on the number of
19 license plates any person qualified under this section may obtain so
20 long as each set of license plates issued under this section is issued for
21 vehicles owned solely or jointly by such person. License plates issued
22 pursuant to the provisions of this section shall not be transferable to any other
23 person except that any registered co-owner of the motor vehicle shall be entitled
24 to operate the motor vehicle with such plates for the duration of the year licensed
25 in the event of the death of the qualified person.

301.3090. Any person who is serving on active duty or has served in any
2 branch of the United States military, including the reserves or national guard,
3 during any part of Operation Enduring Freedom and has not been dishonorably
4 discharged may receive special motor vehicle license plates for any motor vehicle
5 such person owns, either solely or jointly, other than an apportioned motor

6 vehicle or a commercial motor vehicle licensed in excess of eighteen thousand
7 pounds gross weight. Any such person shall make application for the special
8 license plates on a form provided by the director of revenue and furnish such
9 proof of service during Operation Enduring Freedom or proof of status as an
10 honorably discharged veteran as the director may require. Upon presentation of
11 the proof of eligibility and annual payment of the fee required for personalized
12 license plates prescribed by section 301.144, and other fees and documents which
13 may be required by law, the director shall then issue license plates bearing
14 letters or numbers or a combination thereof as determined by the advisory
15 committee established in section 301.129, with the words "OPERATION
16 ENDURING FREEDOM" in place of the words "SHOW-ME STATE". Such plates
17 shall also bear an image of the American flag. The plates shall be clearly visible
18 at night and shall be aesthetically attractive, as prescribed by section
19 301.130. [No more than one set of special license plates shall be issued pursuant
20 to this section to a qualified applicant.] There shall be no limit on the
21 number of license plates any person qualified under this section may
22 obtain so long as each set of license plates issued under this section is
23 issued for vehicles owned solely or jointly by such person. License plates
24 issued pursuant to this section shall not be transferable to any other person
25 except that any registered co-owner of the motor vehicle may operate the motor
26 vehicle for the duration of the year licensed in the event of the death of the
27 qualified person.

301.3116. Any person who is serving or has served in any branch of the
2 United States military, including the reserves or national guard, during any part
3 of Operation Noble Eagle and has not been dishonorably discharged may receive
4 special motor vehicle license plates for any motor vehicle such person owns, either
5 solely or jointly, other than an apportioned motor vehicle or a commercial motor
6 vehicle licensed in excess of eighteen thousand pounds gross weight. Any such
7 person shall make application for the special license plates on a form provided by
8 the director of revenue and furnish such proof of service during Operation Noble
9 Eagle or proof of status as an honorably discharged veteran as the director may
10 require. Upon presentation of the proof of eligibility and annual payment of the
11 fee required for personalized license plates prescribed by section 301.144, and
12 other fees and documents which may be required by law, the director shall then
13 issue license plates bearing letters or numbers or a combination thereof as
14 determined by the advisory committee established in section 301.129, with the

15 words "OPERATION NOBLE EAGLE" in place of the words "SHOW-ME
16 STATE". Such plates shall also bear an image of the American flag. The plates
17 shall be clearly visible at night and shall be aesthetically attractive, as prescribed
18 by section 301.130. [No more than one set of special license plates shall be issued
19 pursuant to this section to a qualified applicant.] There shall be no limit on
20 the number of license plates any person qualified under this section
21 may obtain so long as each set of license plates issued under this
22 section is issued for vehicles owned solely or jointly by such
23 person. License plates issued pursuant to this section shall not be transferable
24 to any other person except that any registered co-owner of the motor vehicle may
25 operate the motor vehicle for the duration of the year licensed in the event of the
26 death of the qualified person.

301.3141. 1. Any parent or sibling who has had a member of his
2 or her immediate family die in the line of duty while serving in the U.S.
3 armed forces, after making an annual payment described in subsection
4 2 of this section to the Veterans of Foreign Wars Department of
5 Missouri and paying all applicable registration fees, may receive
6 special license plates for any vehicle the person owns, either solely or
7 jointly, other than an apportioned motor vehicle or a commercial motor
8 vehicle licensed in excess of eighteen thousand pounds gross
9 weight. The Veterans of Foreign Wars Department of Missouri, in
10 conjunction with the director of the department of revenue, shall
11 design the special license plate. Any immediate family member of a
12 fallen soldier may apply annually for the use of the emblem.

13 2. Upon making a twenty-five dollar contribution to the Veterans
14 of Foreign Wars Department of Missouri, the motor vehicle owner may
15 apply for the special license plate described in this section. If the
16 contribution is made directly to the Veterans of Foreign Wars
17 Department of Missouri, the Veterans of Foreign Wars Department of
18 Missouri shall issue the individual making the contribution a receipt,
19 verifying the contribution, that may be used to apply for the special
20 license plate. If the contribution is made directly to the director of
21 revenue, the director shall note the contribution, and the owner then
22 may apply for the special license plate. All contribution fees shall be
23 remitted to the Veterans of Foreign Wars Department of Missouri.

24 3. Upon presentation of the receipt described in subsection 2 of
25 this section or payment of the twenty-five dollar contribution directly

26 to the department of revenue, payment of a fifteen dollar fee in
27 addition to the regular registration fees, presentation of any documents
28 that may be required by law, and any proof that the applicant's family
29 member died in the line of duty while serving in the United States
30 armed forces as the director may require, the director of revenue shall
31 issue to the vehicle owner a special license plate that shall bear the
32 emblem of a five-pointed star and the words "SOME GAVE ALL" in place
33 of the words "SHOW-ME STATE". Such license plates shall be made
34 with fully reflective material with a common color scheme and design
35 of the standard license plate, shall be clearly visible at night, shall have
36 a reflective white background in the area of the plate configuration,
37 and shall be aesthetically attractive, as prescribed by section
38 301.130. Notwithstanding the provisions of section 301.144, no
39 additional fee shall be charged for the personalization of license plates
40 under this section.

41 4. A vehicle owner who previously was issued a special license
42 plate authorized by this section, but who does not provide a receipt as
43 described under subsection 2 of this section at a subsequent time of
44 registration, shall be issued a new plate that does not bear the emblem
45 described in this section, as otherwise provided by law. The director
46 of revenue shall make necessary rules and regulations for the
47 enforcement of this section and shall design all necessary forms
48 required by this section. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is
49 defined in section 536.010, RSMo, that is created under the authority
50 delegated in this section shall become effective only if it complies with
51 and is subject to all of the provisions of chapter 536, RSMo, and, if
52 applicable, section 536.028, RSMo. This section and chapter 536, RSMo,
53 are nonseverable and if any of the powers vested with the general
54 assembly pursuant to chapter 536, RSMo, to review, to delay the
55 effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently held
56 unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking authority and any rule
57 proposed or adopted after August 28, 2006, shall be invalid and void.

58 5. The provisions of section 301.3150 shall not apply to the
59 specialized license plate created under this section.

301.4000. Any person who served in the active military service in a
2 branch of the armed forces of the United States and was honorably discharged
3 from such service may apply for special motorcycle license plates, either solely or

4 jointly, for issuance for any motorcycle subject to the registration fees provided
5 in section 301.055. Any such person shall make application for the special license
6 plates on a form provided by the director of revenue and furnish such proof of
7 service and status as an honorably discharged veteran as the director may
8 require. Upon presentation of the proof of eligibility and payment of a fifteen
9 dollar fee in addition to the regulation registration fees, and presentation of other
10 documents which may be required by law, the director shall then issue license
11 plates bearing letters or numbers or a combination thereof as determined by the
12 director, with the words "U.S. VET" in place of the words "SHOW-ME
13 STATE". The plates shall be clearly visible at night and shall be aesthetically
14 attractive, as prescribed by section 301.130. [No more than one set of special
15 license plates shall be issued pursuant to this section to a qualified applicant.]
16 There shall be no limit on the number of license plates any person
17 qualified under this section may obtain so long as each set of license
18 plates issued under this section is issued for vehicles owned solely or
19 jointly by such person. License plates issued pursuant to this section shall
20 not be transferable to any other person except that any registered co-owner of the
21 motorcycle may operate the motorcycle for the duration of the year licensed in the
22 event of the death of the qualified person.
