**AN ACT**

To repeal sections 301.445, 301.447, 301.451, 301.456, 301.457, 301.464, 301.465, 301.3054, 301.3085, 301.3090, 301.3116, and 301.4000, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof fifteen new sections relating to special license plates for military personnel.

---

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:*

Section A. Sections 301.445, 301.447, 301.451, 301.456, 301.457, 301.464, 301.465, 301.3054, 301.3085, 301.3090, 301.3116, and 301.4000, RSMo, are repealed and fifteen new sections enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as sections 301.445, 301.447, 301.451, 301.456, 301.457, 301.464, 301.465, 301.3030, 301.3054, 301.3061, 301.3085, 301.3090, 301.3116, 301.3141, and 301.4000, to read as follows:

301.445. Any person who has been awarded the combat infantry badge may apply for special motor vehicle license plates for any vehicle such person owns, either solely or jointly, for issuance either to passenger motor vehicles subject to the registration fees provided in section 301.055, or for a nonlocal property-carrying commercial motor vehicle licensed for a gross weight not in excess of twelve thousand pounds as provided in section 301.057. Any such person shall make application for the special license plates on a form provided by the director of revenue and furnish such proof as a recipient of the combat infantry badge as the director may require. The director shall then issue license plates bearing the words "COMBAT INFANTRYMAN" in place of the words "SHOW-ME STATE" in a form prescribed by the director, except that such license plates shall be made with fully reflective material, shall have a white background with a blue and red configuration at the discretion of the director, shall be

12 clearly visible at night, and shall be aesthetically attractive, as prescribed by section 301.130.  
13 Such plates shall also bear an image of the combat infantry badge. There shall be an additional  
14 fee charged for each set of special combat infantry badge license plates issued equal to the fee  
15 charged for personalized license plates in section 301.144. [No more than one set of combat  
16 infantry badge license plates shall be issued to a qualified applicant.] **There shall be no limit**  
17 **on the number of license plates any person qualified under this section may obtain so long**  
18 **as each set of license plates issued under this section is issued for vehicles owned solely or**  
19 **jointly by such person.** License plates issued pursuant to the provisions of this section shall not  
20 be transferable to any other person except that any registered co-owner of the motor vehicle shall  
21 be entitled to operate the motor vehicle with such plates for the duration of the year licensed in  
22 the event of the death of the qualified person.

301.447. 1. Any member of the United States Military Service who was stationed on or  
2 within three miles of the Hawaiian Island of Oahu on December 7, 1941, during the enemy attack  
3 on Pearl Harbor and other related military installations may apply for special motor vehicle  
4 license plates for one vehicle he owns, either solely or jointly, as provided in this section. Any  
5 such person shall make application for the special license plates on a form provided by the  
6 director of revenue and pay an additional fee equal to the fee charged for personalized license  
7 plates in section 301.144 for the issuance of the license plates provided for herein. Applications  
8 for license plates issued under this section shall be accompanied by such proof of eligibility as  
9 the director may require.

10 2. Notwithstanding the provisions of section 301.130, each such license plate shall be  
11 embossed with the words "PEARL HARBOR SURVIVOR" at the bottom of the plate in the  
12 form prescribed by the advisory committee established in section 301.129. Such license plates  
13 shall be made with fully reflective material, shall have a white background with a blue and red  
14 configuration at the discretion of the advisory committee established in section 301.129, shall  
15 be clearly visible at night, and shall be aesthetically attractive, as prescribed by section 301.130.  
16 Such plates shall be available for issuance either to passenger motor vehicles subject to the  
17 registration fees provided in section 301.055, or to nonlocal property-carrying commercial motor  
18 vehicles licensed for a gross weight of six thousand pounds up through and including twelve  
19 thousand pounds as provided in section 301.057.

20 3. [No more than one set of Pearl Harbor survivor plates shall be issued to a qualified  
21 applicant.] **There shall be no limit on the number of license plates any person qualified**  
22 **under this section may obtain so long as each set of license plates issued under this section**  
23 **is issued for vehicles owned solely or jointly by such person.** License plates issued under the  
24 provisions of this section shall not be transferable to any other person except as provided herein.  
25 Any registered co-owner of a motor vehicle will be entitled to operate the motor vehicle for the

26 duration of the year licensed in the event of the death of the qualified applicant. Pearl Harbor  
27 survivor plates issued under the provisions of this section shall be transferable only to a widow  
28 or widower of a Pearl Harbor survivor.

301.451. Any person who has been awarded the purple heart medal may apply for special  
2 motor vehicle license plates for any vehicle he owns, either solely or jointly, other than  
3 commercial vehicles weighing over twelve thousand pounds. Any such person shall make  
4 application for the special license plates on a form provided by the director of revenue and  
5 furnish such proof as a recipient of the purple heart medal as the director may require. The  
6 director shall then issue license plates bearing letters or numbers or a combination thereof, with  
7 the words "PURPLE HEART" in place of the words "SHOW-ME STATE" in a form prescribed  
8 by the advisory committee established in section 301.129. Such license plates shall be made  
9 with fully reflective material with a common color scheme and design, shall be clearly visible  
10 at night, and shall be aesthetically attractive, as prescribed by section 301.130. There shall be  
11 an additional fee charged for each set of special purple heart license plates issued equal to the  
12 fee charged for personalized license plates, but the additional fee shall only have to be paid once  
13 by the qualified applicant at the time of initial application. [No more than two sets of purple  
14 heart license plates shall be issued to a qualified applicant.] **There shall be no limit on the**  
15 **number of license plates any person qualified under this section may obtain so long as each**  
16 **set of license plates issued under this section is issued for vehicles owned solely or jointly**  
17 **by such person.** License plates issued under the provisions of this section shall not be  
18 transferable to any other person except that any registered co-owner of the motor vehicle shall  
19 be entitled to operate the motor vehicle for the duration of the year licensed in the event of the  
20 death of the qualified person.

301.456. Any person who has been awarded the military service award known as the  
2 "Silver Star" may apply for special motor vehicle license plates for any vehicle such person  
3 owns, either solely or jointly, other than an apportioned motor vehicle or a commercial motor  
4 vehicle licensed in excess of eighteen thousand pounds gross weight. Any such person shall  
5 make application for the special license plates on a form provided by the director of revenue and  
6 furnish such proof as a recipient of the silver star as the director may require. The director shall  
7 then issue license plates bearing letters or numbers or a combination thereof as determined by  
8 the advisory committee established in section 301.129, with the words "SILVER STAR" in place  
9 of the words "SHOW-ME STATE". Such license plates shall be made with fully reflective  
10 material with a common color scheme and design, shall be clearly visible at night, and shall be  
11 aesthetically attractive, as prescribed by section 301.130. Such plates shall also bear an image  
12 of the silver star. There shall be an additional fee charged for each set of silver star license plates  
13 issued pursuant to this section equal to the fee charged for personalized license plates. [No more

14 than two sets of silver star license plates shall be issued to a qualified applicant.] **There shall be**  
15 **no limit on the number of license plates any person qualified under this section may obtain**  
16 **so long as each set of license plates issued under this section is issued for vehicles owned**  
17 **solely or jointly by such person.** License plates issued under the provisions of this section shall  
18 not be transferable to any other person except that any registered co-owner of the motor vehicle  
19 shall be entitled to operate the motor vehicle with such plates for the duration of the year licensed  
20 in the event of the death of the qualified person.

301.457. Any person who served in the Vietnam Conflict and either currently serves in  
2 any branch of the United States armed forces or was honorably discharged from such service may  
3 apply for special motor vehicle license plates, either solely or jointly, for issuance either for any  
4 passenger motor vehicle subject to the registration fees provided in section 301.055 or for a  
5 nonlocal property-carrying commercial motor vehicle licensed for a gross weight of nine  
6 thousand one pounds to twelve thousand pounds as provided in section 301.057, whether such  
7 vehicle is owned solely or jointly. Any such person shall make application for the special license  
8 plates on a form provided by the director of revenue and furnish such proof of service in the  
9 Vietnam Conflict and status as currently serving in a branch of the armed forces of the United  
10 States or as an honorably discharged veteran as the director may require. Upon presentation of  
11 the proof of eligibility and annual payment of the fee required for personalized license plates  
12 prescribed by section 301.144, and other fees and documents which may be required by law, the  
13 director shall then issue license plates bearing letters or numbers or a combination thereof as  
14 determined by the advisory committee established in section 301.129, with the words  
15 "VIETNAM VETERAN" in place of the words "SHOW-ME STATE". Such plates shall also  
16 bear an image of the Vietnam service medal. The plates shall be clearly visible at night and shall  
17 be aesthetically attractive, as prescribed by section 301.130. [No more than one set of special  
18 license plates shall be issued pursuant to this section to a qualified applicant.] **There shall be**  
19 **no limit on the number of license plates any person qualified under this section may obtain**  
20 **so long as each set of license plates issued under this section is issued for vehicles owned**  
21 **solely or jointly by such person.** License plates issued pursuant to this section shall not be  
22 transferable to any other person except that any registered co-owner of the motor vehicle may  
23 operate the motor vehicle for the duration of the year licensed in the event of the death of the  
24 qualified person.

301.464. Any person who served in the Korean War and was honorably discharged from  
2 such service may apply for special motor vehicle license plates, either solely or jointly, for  
3 issuance for any vehicle the person owns, either solely or jointly, other than an apportioned  
4 motor vehicle or commercial motor vehicle licensed in excess of eighteen thousand pounds. Any  
5 such person shall make application for the special license plates on a form provided by the

6 director of revenue and furnish such proof of service in the Korean War and status as an  
7 honorably discharged veteran as the director may require. Upon presentation of the proof of  
8 eligibility and annual payment of the fee required for personalized license plates prescribed by  
9 section 301.144, and other fees and documents which may be required by law, the director shall  
10 then issue license plates bearing letters or numbers or a combination thereof as determined by  
11 the advisory committee established in section 301.129, with the words "KOREAN WAR  
12 VETERAN" in place of the words "SHOW-ME STATE". Such plates shall also bear an image  
13 of the Korean War service medal. The plates shall be clearly visible at night and shall be  
14 aesthetically attractive, as prescribed by section 301.130. [No more than one set of special  
15 license plates shall be issued pursuant to this section to a qualified applicant.] **There shall be**  
16 **no limit on the number of license plates any person qualified under this section may obtain**  
17 **so long as each set of license plates issued under this section is issued for vehicles owned**  
18 **solely or jointly by such person.** License plates issued pursuant to this section shall not be  
19 transferable to any other person except that any registered co-owner of the motor vehicle may  
20 operate the motor vehicle for the duration of the year licensed in the event of the death of the  
21 qualified person.

301.465. Any person who served in World War II and was honorably discharged from  
2 such service may apply for special motor vehicle license plates, either solely or jointly, for  
3 issuance either for any passenger motor vehicle subject to the registration fees provided in  
4 section 301.055, or for a nonlocal property carrying commercial motor vehicle licensed for a  
5 gross weight of nine thousand one pounds to twelve thousand pounds as provided in section  
6 301.057, whether such vehicle is owned solely or jointly. Any such person shall make  
7 application for the special license plates on a form provided by the director of revenue and  
8 furnish such proof of service in World War II and status as an honorably discharged veteran as  
9 the director may require. Upon presentation of the proof of eligibility and annual payment of the  
10 fee required for personalized license plates prescribed by section 301.144, and other fees and  
11 documents which may be required by law, the director shall then issue license plates bearing  
12 letters or numbers or a combination thereof as determined by the advisory committee established  
13 in section 301.129, with the words "WORLD WAR II VETERAN" in place of the words  
14 "SHOW-ME-STATE". Such plates shall also bear an image of the World War II service medal.  
15 The plates shall be clearly visible at night and shall be aesthetically attractive, as prescribed by  
16 section 301.130. [No more than one set of special license plates shall be issued pursuant to this  
17 section to a qualified applicant.] **There shall be no limit on the number of license plates any**  
18 **person qualified under this section may obtain so long as each set of license plates issued**  
19 **under this section is issued for vehicles owned solely or jointly by such person.** License  
20 plates issued pursuant to this section shall not be transferable to any other person except that any

21 registered co-owner of the motor vehicle may operate the motor vehicle for the duration of the  
22 year licensed in the event of the death of the qualified person.

**301.3030. Any special license plates involving military actions or personnel that are  
2 authorized after the effective date of this section shall not limit the number of license plates  
3 any person qualified for such special license plate may obtain so long as each set of license  
4 plates issued is issued for vehicles owned solely or jointly by the qualified applicant.**

301.3054. 1. Any person who served in the active military service in a branch of the  
2 armed services of the United States and was honorably discharged from such service may apply  
3 for special personalized license plates for any vehicle other than an apportioned motor vehicle  
4 or a commercial motor vehicle licensed in excess of eighteen thousand pounds gross weight.  
5 Any such person shall make application for the special license plates on a form provided by the  
6 director of revenue and furnish such proof of service and status as an honorably discharged  
7 veteran as the director may require.

8 2. Upon presentation of proof of eligibility and payment of a fifteen dollar fee in addition  
9 to the regular registration fees, and presentation of any documents which may be required by law,  
10 the director shall issue to the vehicle owner special personalized license plates with the words  
11 "U.S. VET" in place of the words "SHOW-ME STATE". Such license plates shall be made with  
12 fully reflective material with a common color scheme and design, shall be clearly visible at night,  
13 shall have a reflective white background with a blue and red configuration in the area of the plate  
14 configuration, and shall be aesthetically attractive, as prescribed by section 301.130.  
15 Notwithstanding the provisions of section 301.144, no additional fee shall be charged for the  
16 personalization of license plates pursuant to this section.

17 3. [No more than one set of special license plates shall be issued pursuant to this section  
18 to a qualified applicant.] **There shall be no limit on the number of license plates any person  
19 qualified under this section may obtain so long as each set of license plates issued under  
20 this section is issued for vehicles owned solely or jointly by such person.** License plates  
21 issued pursuant to this section shall not be transferable to any other person except that any  
22 registered co-owner of the vehicle may operate the vehicle for the duration of the registration in  
23 the event of the death of the qualified person. The director of revenue shall make necessary rules  
24 and regulations for the enforcement of this section, and shall design all necessary forms required  
25 by this section. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010, RSMo,  
26 that is created under the authority delegated in this section shall become effective only if it  
27 complies with and is subject to all of the provisions of chapter 536, RSMo, and, if applicable,  
28 section 536.028, RSMo. This section and chapter 536, RSMo, are nonseverable and if any of  
29 the powers vested with the general assembly pursuant to chapter 536, RSMo, to review, to delay  
30 the effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently held unconstitutional, then

31 the grant of rulemaking authority and any rule proposed or adopted after August 28, 2004, shall  
32 be invalid and void.

**301.3061. 1. Any person eligible for membership in the Disabled American Veterans and who possess a valid membership card issued by the Disabled American Veterans may apply for Missouri Disabled American Veterans license plates for any motor vehicle the person owns, either solely or jointly, other than an apportioned motor vehicle or a commercial motor vehicle licensed in excess of eighteen thousand pounds gross weight. The Missouri Disabled American Veterans hereby authorizes the use of its official emblem to be affixed on multiyear personalized license plates as provided in this section.**

**2. Upon presentation of a current photo identification, the person's valid membership card issued by the Disabled American Veterans, and payment of a fifteen dollar fee in addition to the regular registration fees and presentation of other documents which may be required by law, the department of revenue shall issue a personalized license plate to the vehicle owner, which shall bear the emblem of the Disabled American Veterans, an emblem consisting exclusively of a red letter "D", followed by a white letter "A" and a blue letter "V" in modified block letters, with each letter having a black shaded edging, and shall engrave the words "WARTIME DISABLED" in red letters centered near the bottom of the plate. Such license plates shall be made with fully reflective material with a common color scheme and design, shall be clearly visible at night, and shall be aesthetically attractive, as prescribed by section 301.130. A fee for the issuance of personalized license plates issued under section 301.144 shall not be required for plates issued under this section.**

**3. Any person who applies for a Disabled American Veterans license plate under this section to be used on a vehicle commonly known and referred to as a pickup truck may be issued a Disabled American Veterans license plate with the designation "beyond local" indicated in the upper right corner of the plate.**

**4. The director shall promulgate rules to implement the provisions of this section. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010, RSMo, that is created under the authority delegated in this section shall become effective only if it complies with and is subject to all of the provisions of chapter 536, RSMo, and, if applicable, section 536.028, RSMo. This section and chapter 536, RSMo, are nonseverable and if any of the powers vested with the general assembly pursuant to chapter 536, RSMo, to review, to delay the effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently held unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking authority and any rule proposed or adopted after August 28, 2006, shall be invalid and void.**

301.3085. Any person who has participated in active duty combat action while serving  
2 in the United States Marine Corps or the United States Navy may apply for special motor vehicle  
3 license plates for any vehicle such person owns, either solely or jointly, other than an apportioned  
4 motor vehicle licensed in excess of eighteen thousand pounds gross weight. Any such person  
5 shall make application for the special license plates on a form provided by the director of revenue  
6 and furnish such proof as a recipient of the combat infantry badge as the director may require.  
7 The director shall then issue license plates bearing the words "COMBAT ACTION RIBBON"  
8 in place of the words "SHOW-ME STATE" in a form prescribed by the director, except that such  
9 license plates shall be made with fully reflective material, shall have a white background with  
10 a blue and red configuration at the discretion of the director, shall be clearly visible at night, and  
11 shall be aesthetically attractive, as prescribed by section 301.130. Such plates shall also bear an  
12 image of a blue, yellow, and red ribbon. There shall be an additional fee charged for each set of  
13 special combat action ribbon license plates issued equal to the fee charged for personalized  
14 license plates in section 301.144. [No more than one set of combat action ribbon license plates  
15 shall be issued to a qualified applicant.] **There shall be no limit on the number of license  
16 plates any person qualified under this section may obtain so long as each set of license  
17 plates issued under this section is issued for vehicles owned solely or jointly by such person.**  
18 License plates issued pursuant to the provisions of this section shall not be transferable to any  
19 other person except that any registered co-owner of the motor vehicle shall be entitled to operate  
20 the motor vehicle with such plates for the duration of the year licensed in the event of the death  
21 of the qualified person.

301.3090. Any person who is serving on active duty or has served in any branch of the  
2 United States military, including the reserves or national guard, during any part of Operation  
3 Enduring Freedom and has not been dishonorably discharged may receive special motor vehicle  
4 license plates for any motor vehicle such person owns, either solely or jointly, other than an  
5 apportioned motor vehicle or a commercial motor vehicle licensed in excess of eighteen  
6 thousand pounds gross weight. Any such person shall make application for the special license  
7 plates on a form provided by the director of revenue and furnish such proof of service during  
8 Operation Enduring Freedom or proof of status as an honorably discharged veteran as the  
9 director may require. Upon presentation of the proof of eligibility and annual payment of the fee  
10 required for personalized license plates prescribed by section 301.144, and other fees and  
11 documents which may be required by law, the director shall then issue license plates bearing  
12 letters or numbers or a combination thereof as determined by the advisory committee established  
13 in section 301.129, with the words "OPERATION ENDURING FREEDOM" in place of the  
14 words "SHOW-ME STATE". Such plates shall also bear an image of the American flag. The  
15 plates shall be clearly visible at night and shall be aesthetically attractive, as prescribed by



16 section 301.130. [No more than one set of special license plates shall be issued pursuant to this  
17 section to a qualified applicant.] **There shall be no limit on the number of license plates any**  
18 **person qualified under this section may obtain so long as each set of license plates issued**  
19 **under this section is issued for vehicles owned solely or jointly by such person.** License  
20 plates issued pursuant to this section shall not be transferable to any other person except that any  
21 registered co-owner of the motor vehicle may operate the motor vehicle for the duration of the  
22 year licensed in the event of the death of the qualified person.

301.3116. Any person who is serving or has served in any branch of the United States  
2 military, including the reserves or national guard, during any part of Operation Noble Eagle and  
3 has not been dishonorably discharged may receive special motor vehicle license plates for any  
4 motor vehicle such person owns, either solely or jointly, other than an apportioned motor vehicle  
5 or a commercial motor vehicle licensed in excess of eighteen thousand pounds gross weight.  
6 Any such person shall make application for the special license plates on a form provided by the  
7 director of revenue and furnish such proof of service during Operation Noble Eagle or proof of  
8 status as an honorably discharged veteran as the director may require. Upon presentation of the  
9 proof of eligibility and annual payment of the fee required for personalized license plates  
10 prescribed by section 301.144, and other fees and documents which may be required by law, the  
11 director shall then issue license plates bearing letters or numbers or a combination thereof as  
12 determined by the advisory committee established in section 301.129, with the words  
13 "OPERATION NOBLE EAGLE" in place of the words "SHOW-ME STATE". Such plates shall  
14 also bear an image of the American flag. The plates shall be clearly visible at night and shall be  
15 aesthetically attractive, as prescribed by section 301.130. [No more than one set of special  
16 license plates shall be issued pursuant to this section to a qualified applicant.] **There shall be**  
17 **no limit on the number of license plates any person qualified under this section may obtain**  
18 **so long as each set of license plates issued under this section is issued for vehicles owned**  
19 **solely or jointly by such person.** License plates issued pursuant to this section shall not be  
20 transferable to any other person except that any registered co-owner of the motor vehicle may  
21 operate the motor vehicle for the duration of the year licensed in the event of the death of the  
22 qualified person.

**301.3141. 1. Any parent or sibling who has had a member of his or her immediate**  
2 **family die in the line of duty while serving in the U.S. armed forces, after making an**  
3 **annual payment described in subsection 2 of this section to the Veterans of Foreign Wars**  
4 **Department of Missouri and paying all applicable registration fees, may receive special**  
5 **license plates for any vehicle the person owns, either solely or jointly, other than an**  
6 **apportioned motor vehicle or a commercial motor vehicle licensed in excess of eighteen**  
7 **thousand pounds gross weight. The Veterans of Foreign Wars Department of Missouri,**

8 in conjunction with the director of the department of revenue, shall design the special  
9 license plate. Any immediate family member of a fallen soldier may apply annually for  
10 the use of the emblem.

11 2. Upon making a twenty-five dollar contribution to the Veterans of Foreign Wars  
12 Department of Missouri, the motor vehicle owner may apply for the special license plate  
13 described in this section. If the contribution is made directly to the Veterans of Foreign  
14 Wars Department of Missouri, the Veterans of Foreign Wars Department of Missouri shall  
15 issue the individual making the contribution a receipt, verifying the contribution, that may  
16 be used to apply for the special license plate. If the contribution is made directly to the  
17 director of revenue, the director shall note the contribution, and the owner then may apply  
18 for the special license plate. All contribution fees shall be remitted to the Veterans of  
19 Foreign Wars Department of Missouri.

20 3. Upon presentation of the receipt described in subsection 2 of this section or  
21 payment of the twenty-five dollar contribution directly to the department of revenue,  
22 payment of a fifteen dollar fee in addition to the regular registration fees, presentation of  
23 any documents that may be required by law, and any proof that the applicant's family  
24 member died in the line of duty while serving in the United States armed forces as the  
25 director may require, the director of revenue shall issue to the vehicle owner a special  
26 license plate that shall bear the emblem of a five-pointed star and the words "SOME  
27 GAVE ALL" in place of the words "SHOW-ME STATE". Such license plates shall be  
28 made with fully reflective material with a common color scheme and design of the standard  
29 license plate, shall be clearly visible at night, shall have a reflective white background in  
30 the area of the plate configuration, and shall be aesthetically attractive, as prescribed by  
31 section 301.130. Notwithstanding the provisions of section 301.144, no additional fee shall  
32 be charged for the personalization of license plates under this section.

33 4. A vehicle owner who previously was issued a special license plate authorized by  
34 this section, but who does not provide a receipt as described under subsection 2 of this  
35 section at a subsequent time of registration, shall be issued a new plate that does not bear  
36 the emblem described in this section, as otherwise provided by law. The director of  
37 revenue shall make necessary rules and regulations for the enforcement of this section and  
38 shall design all necessary forms required by this section. Any rule or portion of a rule, as  
39 that term is defined in section 536.010, RSMo, that is created under the authority delegated  
40 in this section shall become effective only if it complies with and is subject to all of the  
41 provisions of chapter 536, RSMo, and, if applicable, section 536.028, RSMo. This section  
42 and chapter 536, RSMo, are nonseverable and if any of the powers vested with the general  
43 assembly pursuant to chapter 536, RSMo, to review, to delay the effective date, or to

44 **disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently held unconstitutional, then the grant of**  
45 **rulemaking authority and any rule proposed or adopted after August 28, 2006, shall be**  
46 **invalid and void.**

47 **5. The provisions of section 301.3150 shall not apply to the specialized license plate**  
48 **created under this section.**

301.4000. Any person who served in the active military service in a branch of the armed  
2 forces of the United States and was honorably discharged from such service may apply for  
3 special motorcycle license plates, either solely or jointly, for issuance for any motorcycle subject  
4 to the registration fees provided in section 301.055. Any such person shall make application for  
5 the special license plates on a form provided by the director of revenue and furnish such proof  
6 of service and status as an honorably discharged veteran as the director may require. Upon  
7 presentation of the proof of eligibility and payment of a fifteen dollar fee in addition to the  
8 regulation registration fees, and presentation of other documents which may be required by law,  
9 the director shall then issue license plates bearing letters or numbers or a combination thereof  
10 as determined by the director, with the words "U.S. VET" in place of the words "SHOW-ME  
11 STATE". The plates shall be clearly visible at night and shall be aesthetically attractive, as  
12 prescribed by section 301.130. [No more than one set of special license plates shall be issued  
13 pursuant to this section to a qualified applicant.] **There shall be no limit on the number of**  
14 **license plates any person qualified under this section may obtain so long as each set of**  
15 **license plates issued under this section is issued for vehicles owned solely or jointly by such**  
16 **person.** License plates issued pursuant to this section shall not be transferable to any other  
17 person except that any registered co-owner of the motorcycle may operate the motorcycle for the  
18 duration of the year licensed in the event of the death of the qualified person.
