AN ACT

To amend chapter 640, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to registered environmental professionals.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 640, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new section, to be 2 known as section 640.077, to read as follows:

640.077. 1. As used in this section, the following terms mean:

(1) "Applicant", a person applying for registration as a registered environmental
 professional;

4 (2) "Closure report", a final report documenting that surfaces or subsurface 5 conditions related to a site have been investigated, that all remedial action was conducted 6 in accordance with all applicable department requirements, that any applicable 7 institutional controls are in full, force, and effect, and that the site does not present a threat 8 to public health, safety, or the environment. A closure report involving geological 9 conditions shall be sealed by a registered geologist. A closure report involving engineered 10 structures shall be sealed by a professional engineer;

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(3) "Department", the Missouri department of natural resources;

12 (4) "Permit", a construction permit or operating permit issued by the Missouri 13 clean air commission under chapter 643, RSMo, or a construction permit or Missouri state

(5) "Professional engineer", a person certified as a professional by the division of
 professional registration, Missouri board of architects, professional engineers, professional
 land surveyors, and landscape architects, in accordance with the requirements in chapter
 327, RSMo;

19 (6) "Registered environmental professional", a person registered by the 20 department as meeting the professional qualifications in subsection 2 of this section;

(7) "Registered geologist", a person certified as a registered geologist by the board
 of geologist registration within the division of professional registration, in accordance with
 the requirements in chapter 256, RSMo;

(8) "Remedial action", any action taken to remediate surface or subsurface
environmental conditions at a site, whether conducted by a party enrolled in the voluntary
cleanup program or directed by the department under its authority under chapter 260,
319, 643, or 644, RSMo;

- (9) "Work plan", a proposed scope of work to conduct any surface or subsurface
 investigation of environmental conditions at a site, or to implement a remedial action of
 surface or subsurface environmental conditions at a site.
- 31 2. A person possessing certification as a professional engineer or registered 32 geologist in this state may apply to the department to be registered as a registered 33 environmental professional. In one or more of the substantive areas, the applicant shall 34 demonstrate at least ten years of experience and proficiency in designing the scope of work for a surface or subsurface investigation of environmental conditions at a site, designing 35 the scope of work for a remedial action at a site, implementing a site investigation or 36 37 remedial action at a site, or designing, drafting, preparing, and implementing the terms, 38 conditions, or other relevant provisions in permits. The department shall not impose any 39 requirements, including, but not limited to, professional qualification or professional 40 education requirements, on any applicant or any registered environmental professional. 41 3. If the applicant demonstrates compliance with the requirements in subsection 42

42 2 of this section, the department shall issue to the applicant the registration as a registered 43 environmental professional within thirty days of receipt. If the application is denied, the 44 department shall advise the applicant in writing of the deficiencies in the application and 45 shall provide all reasons for such denial. An applicant whose application is denied may 46 appeal such denial to the administrative hearing commission as a contested case under 47 sections 536.100 to 536.140, RSMo. The burden shall be on the department to show that 48 the applicant failed to comply with the requirements of subsection 2 of this section.

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49 4. A registered environmental professional shall demonstrate financial 50 responsibility, either by maintaining, in effect, an errors and omissions professional liability insurance policy in an amount of at least one million dollars per occurrence or 51 52 demonstrating that the employer of the registered environmental professional has a net 53 financial worth of at least five million dollars. A registered environmental professional shall maintain his or her professional certification as either a professional engineer or 54 registered geologist for the period of such registration. If any registered environmental 55 56 professional fails to maintain the requirements in this subsection, such failure shall be 57 grounds for the department to revoke such registration.

58 5. A registered environmental professional may prepare and submit to the 59 department for review a proposed permit, work plan, or closure report. Any proposed 60 permit, work plan, or closure report shall be submitted to the department via certified 61 United States mail, return receipt requested. The registered environmental professional 62 shall demonstrate financial responsibility by either including his or her client and the department as additional insureds on the declarations in the registered environmental 63 professional's errors and omissions professional liability insurance, or providing a 64 declaration that the employer of the registered environmental professional will indemnify 65 the client and the department for any willful or negligent acts or omissions of the registered 66 67 environmental professional. A copy of the relevant declaration shall be included in any 68 submission to the department under this subsection.

69 6. The department may review the proposed permit, work plan, or closure report 70 for forty-five days, and may, in the department's discretion, provide comments or request 71 that additional information be submitted. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to 72 the contrary, at the end of the forty-fifth day after the date the department received the 73 submission, if the department has not provided any comments or requested any additional 74 information, the proposed permit, work plan, or closure report shall be approved by 75 operation of law. After a registered environmental professional submits responses to 76 comments or provides additional information, the department may review such responses 77 or additional information for twenty days, at which time the proposed permit, work plan, 78 or closure report shall be approved by operation of law, unless the department makes 79 additional comments or requests additional information.

80 7. The department may revoke registration as a registered environmental 81 professional for good cause, may notify the division of professional registration of such 82 revocation proceeding, and may bring an action for damages and injunctive relief against 83 the registered environmental professional, the employer, or his or her professional liability H.B. 1720

- 86 **8. The department shall maintain a listing of all persons who have been approved**
- 87 as a registered environmental professional and shall make such listing available to the
- 88 public for no charge.
