Now, therefore, be it resolved that the members of the House of 25 Representatives of the Ninety-third General Assembly, Second Regular Session, the Senate 26 27 concurring therein, hereby create a Joint Interim Committee on Commercial Video 28 Programming Services to be comprised on five members of the House of Representatives, 29 appointed by the Speaker of the House and minority leader of the House, and five members of the Senate, appointed by the President Pro Tem of the Senate and minority floor leader of 31 the Senate, and such committee is authorized to function during the Second Regular Session 32 and the legislative interim of the Ninety-third General Assembly; and 33 Be it further resolved that the committee shall examine and study 34 35 relevant issues pertaining to commercial video programming services and make appropriate 36 recommendations, including but not limited to, recommendations on financial, legal, taxation, technological, competitive, regulatory, and economic issues of cable television, 37 38 satellite television, and Internet protocol television services; and 39 Be it further resolved that the committee shall prepare a final report, 40 together with its recommendations for any legislative action deemed necessary for 41 42 submission to the General Assembly prior to commencement of the First Regular Session of 43 the Ninety-fourth General Assembly; and 44 Be it further resolved that the committee may solicit input and 45 information necessary to fulfill its obligations, including but not limited to soliciting input 46 47 and information from the Public Service Commission, the Department of Economic 48 Development, political subdivisions of this state, commercial video service providers, 49 including cable television, satellite television, and telecommunications companies, and 50 consumers of this state; and 51 Be it further resolved that the staffs of House Research, the Joint 52 Committee on Legislative Research, and Senate Research shall provide such legal, research, 53 54 clerical, technical, and bill drafting services as the committee may require in the performance H.C.R. 16 3

Be it further resolved that the actual and necessary expenses of the
