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**AN ACT**

To amend chapters 28 and 43, RSMo, by adding thereto two new sections relating to highway patrol enforcement of federal immigration laws.

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*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:*

Section A. Chapters 28 and 43, RSMo, are amended by adding thereto two new sections,  
2 to be known as sections 28.824 and 43.032, to read as follows:

**28.824. All law enforcement officers shall inquire into the citizenship and**  
2 **immigration status of any person under arrest for a violation of any state law or municipal**  
3 **ordinance, regardless of the person's national origin, ethnicity, or race. In all such cases**  
4 **where a person indicates that he or she is not a citizen or national of the United States, the**  
5 **law enforcement agent shall verify with the federal government whether the alien is**  
6 **lawfully or unlawfully present in the United States, under 8 U.S.C. 1373(c). If the alien is**  
7 **verified to be unlawfully present in the United States, the law enforcement officer shall**  
8 **cooperate with any request by federal immigration authorities to detain the alien or**  
9 **transfer the alien to the custody of the federal government.**

**43.032. Subject to appropriation, the superintendent of the Missouri state highway**  
2 **patrol shall designate that some or all members of the highway patrol be trained in**  
3 **accordance with a memorandum of understanding between the state of Missouri and the**  
4 **United States Department of Homeland Security concerning the enforcement of federal**  
5 **immigration laws on federal highways and interstates in the state of Missouri, in**

6 accordance with 8 U.S.C. Section 1357(g). The superintendent shall have the authority to  
7 negotiate the terms of such memorandum. The memorandum shall be signed by the  
8 superintendent of the highway patrol, the governor, and the director of the department of  
9 public safety.

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
