7	Whereas, trade between Taiwan and the United States has increased significantly
8 9 10	during the past decades, with the United States being Taiwan's second-largest source of imports, and Taiwan being the eighth-largest trading partner of the United States; and
11	Whereas, Taiwan ranks the fifth-largest overseas markets for United States
12 13 14 15 16	agricultural products in general, including the third-largest buyer of United States beef and corn products, the fifth-largest buyer of United States soybean products, the eighth-largest buyer of United States wheat, and the second-largest customer of United States agricultural products worldwide in terms of per capita consumption; and
17	Whereas, the United States International Trade Commission found that, with a
18 19 20 21	Taiwan-United States free trade agreement in place, United States exports to Taiwan would increase by 16%, or roughly \$3.4 billion annually, and the broader interests of the United States in the Asia-Pacific region would be served:
