#### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### ASSUMPTION

Officials of the **Pulaski County Sewer District** stated that this proposal would make it harder to collect the service charges. Officials concluded that the only clout they would have is to file liens. Officials estimate this could cost them up to 5% of their revenues or \$58,000 annually.

Officials of the **City of Kansas City** stated that they assume that as much \$10,535,400.00 could be at risk form FY 2008 thru FY 2010 in water and sewer revenues. This risk is based upon 2000 Census bureau data regarding the number of tenant occupied residences serviced by the Kansas City Water Department. Sewer charges are particularly at risk because it is not readily possible to render a sewer line unusable due to the potential of creation of health or environmental hazards.

Officials stated that currently their cost of service does not reflect these proposed changes and they would have to increase water & sewer rates to all residential customers to account for the cost of preparing and sending multiple billing statements to owners and tenants of the same property, if we continued to allow tenants to have water and sewer accounts. Also this change would make all residential customers liable for any past due accounts that are 90 days or greater. This also would likely cause the City to consider a policy that requires only owners of properties to open water & sewer service accounts, thus preventing tenants from obtaining such service in their own name.

Officials of the **City of West** Plains assume this proposal would have some fiscal impact on the city. Officials stated that fiscal impact is indeterminable and unknown.

Officials of the **City of Poplar Bluff** assume there could be some fiscal impact from collecting delinquent accounts.

Officials of the City of Centralia assume no fiscal impact.

Officials of the City of Raytown issued a statement of recommendations.

**Oversight** assumes this proposal prohibits municipalities from holding owners of rental property liable for a renters delinquent utility bills.

## ASSUMPTION (continued)

**Oversight** assumes there would be costs associated with locating tenants, and trying to collect in court action. **Oversight** will show an unknown loss of income to cities. Loss of income from delinquent utility collections on a statewide basis is expected to exceed \$100,000.

### FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

#### FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This bill prohibits a municipality supplying an occupant of a premise with a utility service from holding the owner of the premise liable for the occupant's delinquent utility payment. The municipality can recover reasonable attorney fees in a civil suit against the occupant.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
