FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials at the **Department of Revenue** (DOR) assume no fiscal impact for their department for this proposal. DOR officials stated there would be a reduction to General Revenue equal to the amount of tax currently being paid by companies on these purchases. This amount is unknown to DOR.

Officials from the **Department of Conservation** (**MDC**) state this legislation would appear to have a negative fiscal impact on MDC funds since it appears to exempt highway construction materials and other MoDOT projects from sales tax. However, MDC is unable to provide the estimated amount and will rely on DOR for the fiscal impact of this legislation.

Officials from the **University of Missouri Economic Policy and Research Center** stated they were unable to estimate the potential impact of this proposal.

Oversight assumes there would be a significant but unknown negative fiscal impact from this proposal, and that the state General Revenue Fund, Conservation Commission Fund, Parks and Soils Fund, and local governments would have a reduction in sales tax revenues if the proposal is enacted.
