FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

According to officials from the **Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DES)**, the impact on school districts could be zero or could be significant. Any fiscal impact would depend upon the extent to which school districts choose to commission officers and whether the officers represent new costs to the district or are merely replacing costs of existing school enforcement measures. DES stated there would be no fiscal impact to their agency.

Officials from the **Independence School District** stated this proposal would have no fiscal impact on their district.

Officials from the **Sikeston School District** responded; however, did not determine an estimate of direct fiscal impact, if any.

Oversight assumes the language in this proposal is permissive, therefore, will assume no fiscal impact for the school districts.
