FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Elementary and Secondary Education, Department of Health and Senior Services, Department of Public Safety – Missouri State Highway Patrol, and the – Director’s Office** assume the proposal would have no fiscal impact on their agencies.

Officials from the **Office of State Courts Administrator** assume the proposed legislation would have no fiscal impact on the courts.

Officials from the **Poplar Bluff R-1 School District** did not respond to Oversight’s request for fiscal impact. However, in response to a similar proposal from the 2006 Session (HB 1115, LR # 3687-01), officials assumed this proposal could have a positive fiscal impact on public schools.

Officials from the **Columbia School District** did not respond to Oversight’s request for fiscal impact. However, in response to a similar proposal from the 2006 Session (HB 1115, LR # 3687-01), officials assumed the proposal could have a significant fiscal impact on their district. Officials did not quantify the impact.

Oversight assumes that the training requirement by school districts is elective. Therefore, Oversight assumes no fiscal impact to the local school districts.

Officials from Kansas City Public Schools, Mexico Public Schools, Nixa Public Schools, Parkway Public Schools, and St. Louis Public Schools did not respond to Oversight’s request for fiscal impact.

The proposed legislation appears to have no fiscal impact.

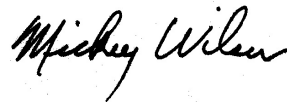
This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
