#### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### **ASSUMPTION**

Officials from the **Department of Elementary and Secondary Education** state this proposal will have no fiscal impact on their agency and minimal, if any, impact on local school districts.

Officials from the **Department of Social Services - Division of Youth Services (DOS-DYS)** assume their division will be able to absorb costs related to developing a crisis plan, delivering staff training and conducting annual drills. However, an effective plan may require safety equipment not currently in place (such as intercom systems). Additionally, some sites may require interior updates in order to properly secure areas within the facility (such as locking classrooms). It is estimated that the average need of each of the division's 42 sites would not exceed \$2,500 each or a total of less than \$100,000.

**Oversight** assumes that until a determination is made that additional safety equipment is required, there would not be additional cost to DOS-DYS. If the need is determined, funding can be sought through the budget process.

Officials from the **University of Missouri - Kansas City** assume there would be no fiscal impact on the Missouri Center for Safe Schools.

Officials from the **Mexico School District** and the **Fair Grove School District** indicated there would be no fiscal impact to their districts as a result of this proposed legislation.
