### FISCAL ANALYSIS

### **ASSUMPTION**

Officials from the **Missouri Gaming Commission** and the **Department of Public Safety - Missouri Highway Patrol** each assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their agency.

In response to a similar proposal from this year (HB 322), officials from the **Office of Prosecution Services** assumed the proposal would not have a significant direct fiscal impact on county prosecutors or the Office of Prosecution Services.

In response to a similar proposal from 2006 (SB 803), officials from the **Office of the Attorney General (AGO)** assumed that costs could be absorbed. However, in the event the AGO was asked to initiate a prosecution under this provision, there could be significant costs in handling that prosecution. Such costs would likely be less than \$100,000.
