FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Economic Development (DED)** - **Public Service**Commission, DED - Office of Public Council, Department of Public Safety (DPS)
Director's Office, DPS - Missouri State Highway Patrol, Office of State Courts

Administrator, and **Department of Revenue** assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organizations.

In response to an earlier version of this proposal, officials from the City of Centralia, City of Kansas City, and City of West Plains assumed the proposal would have no fiscal impact on their organizations. Officials from St. Louis County stated the proposal would result in indirect savings in increased property values, increased investment by developers, reduced vandalism, fewer Police calls, etc. The office estimated that St. Louis County property owners suffer approximately \$1.5 million in loss, damage, and increased security costs each year, directly linked to metal theft. Cost to the St. Louis County Police, called to respond to and investigate metal theft, could be estimated at about \$5,000 per year.

Oversight assumes the overall impact of this proposal on local governments to be minimal.

Officials from the **Office of Attorney General (AGO)** did not respond to our request for a statement of fiscal impact. However, in response to an earlier version of this proposal, the AGO assumed any potential costs arising as a result of the proposal could be absorbed with existing resources.
