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FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Health and Senior Services** and the **Office of Administration** each assume the proposal would have no fiscal impact on their respective agencies.

Officials from the **Department of Social Services (DSS) - Division of Medical Services (DMS)** state the following:

Section 191.1000.1 and .2: Requires that beginning January 1, 2008 the state of Missouri will be prohibited from purchasing or paying for any vaccine that is not "ethical" unless there is not an ethical vaccine available. "Ethical" is defined as any vaccine that is not produced using cell culture derived from an aborted fetus.

<u>Section 191.1000.3</u>: Requires that beginning January 1, 2010 the state of Missouri shall not purchase or pay for any vaccine unless it is ethical.

The DMS assumes that this proposal intends to cover the payment or purchase of vaccine only and does not apply to the administration of the vaccine.

The proposal does not define who would be responsible for determining which vaccines are ethical vs. non-ethical.

Vaccines used in the federal entitlement Vaccines for Children program in Missouri are acquired directly from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). This program covers Medicaid, uninsured and under-insured children. No general revenue funds are used to purchase these vaccines. Therefore, there will be no fiscal impact due to this section.

<u>Section 191.1000.4:</u> Requires that parents and legal guardians of children as well as adults who are given vaccines that are not ethical shall be informed that the vaccine was manufactured using cell culture derived from an aborted fetus.

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ASSUMPTION (continued)

The proposal does not state who shall make that notification. DMS assumes the provider will be responsible for providing this information. Currently, Vaccination Information Statements (VIS) published by the CDC are provided prior to vaccinations. This statement does not include information required by this legislation. Therefore, additional information would need to be supplied. If the DSS is required to make this notification there will be a cost for resources and staff to implement the notification for two years (January, 2008 - January, 2010). This cost is unknown.

DMS assumes that the proposal applies only to the payment or purchase of vaccine. However, if the intent of the proposal is to prohibit reimbursement for the administration of non-ethical vaccines then more children and adults will become sick and need medical services and treatment. That cost is unknown but greater than \$100,000.

This legislation defines "ethical vaccine" and requires the use of ethical vaccines unless no alternative is available. After January 1, 2010, the state will no longer purchase or reimburse any vaccine other than an ethical vaccine.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
