FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Public Safety** state this proposal will have no fiscal impact on their agency.

Officials from the **Office of the Governor** state there should be no added cost to the Governor's Office as a result of this proposed legislation.

Officials from the **Department of Revenue (DOR)** responded that changing procedures and updating the website will have minimal administrative impact on their agency.

The proposal removes the \$4 fee for each removable windshield placard. DOR has not been collecting the fee since February, 2006 as the result of an appellate decision rendering the fee unconstitutional. **Oversight** assumes there will be no loss of revenue since the fee is not currently being collected.

DOR currently issues an average of approximately 185,000 placard renewals each year. The savings in placards, renewal forms, postage, and envelope savings will be approximately \$100,085 in FY11 and FY12.

The **Office of Administration Information Technology (ITSD DOR)** estimates that this legislation could be implemented utilizing existing resources of 1 existing CIT I for two months at a rate of \$4,546 and 2 existing CIT III's for 2 months at a rate of \$4,186. However, if priorities shift and additional FTE/overtime would be needed to implement, the cost will be approximately \$25,836. They plan to use existing resources to implement this legislation.

The effective date of this proposal is January 1, 2008.
