Bill Summary: This proposal modifies the requirements for forwarding of records for entry in the Missouri Uniform Law Enforcement System; removes the requirement that a licensed physician, registered nurse, or trained medical technician must use a nonalcoholic antiseptic for cleansing the skin prior to drawing blood for the purpose of determining the alcohol content of the blood; and modifies various provisions related to the St. Louis Board of Police Commissioners..

FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Office of the State Courts Administrator** assume the proposal would not fiscally impact the courts.

Officials from the **Department of Revenue** and the **Department of Public Safety - Missouri Highway Patrol** each assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

Senate Amendment 1 - Removal of nonalcoholic antiseptic requirement;

In response to a similar proposal from this year (HB 999), officials from the **Office of State Courts Administrator, Department of Transportation, Department of Health and Senior Services, Department of Revenue, Department of Public Safety – Missouri State Highway Patrol**, and the – **Director’s Office** each assumed this proposal would have no fiscal impact on their respective agencies.

Senate Amendment 3 - St. Louis Board of Police Commissioners;

For a similar proposal from this year (HB 923), **Oversight** sent response request to St. Louis City officials of the Police Board and Police Department and have received no response.

In response to similar legislation of last session (fiscal note 5169-01 SB 1097) **St. Louis Officials** of the **Metropolitan Police Department** assumed no fiscal impact.

Oversight assumes this proposal grants authority to the St. Louis Board of Police Commissioners to delegate certain duties to others. **Oversight** assumes this proposal is discretionary and would have no fiscal impact. **Oversight** assumes no state fiscal impact.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION


The proposed legislation appears to have no fiscal impact.
