#### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### **ASSUMPTION**

Officials from the **Missouri Senate** that this proposal either has no fiscal impact as it relates to their agency or minimal costs which can be absorbed by present appropriations.

Officials from the **Office of Secretary of State (SOS)** assume many bills considered by the General Assembly include provisions allowing or requiring agencies to submit rules and regulations to implement the act. The SOS is provided with core funding to handle a certain amount of normal activity resulting from each year's legislative session. The fiscal impact to the SOS office for Administrative Rules is less than \$2,500. The SOS recognizes this is a small amount and does not expect additional funding would be required to meet these costs. However, SOS also recognizes that many such bills may be passed in a given year and that collectively the costs may be in excess of what the SOS can sustain with their core budget. Any additional required funding would be handled through the budget process.

Officials from the **Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE)** assume this proposal would give DESE the oversight and administrative functions currently held by the Missouri State High School Activities Association (MSHSAA). Per the report of Association Finances - General Operations, FY 1997 to FY 2007, total expenses for FY06-07 were \$5,507,065. Included in the total are expenses for rental space and salaries and benefits for 25 FTE.

The proposal would allow the DESE to charge fees associated with providing services and to participate in licensing arrangements that generate revenue to offset the cost of administration; however, DESE cannot estimate at what point it would generate such offsetting revenues.

**Oversight** assumes that DESE would charge fees and participate in licensing arrangements as outlined in the proposal in a sufficient amount to offset the cost of administration. **Oversight** notes that the proposal is permissive; therefore, will show, for fiscal note purposes only, no income or cost to General Revenue. Should DESE, at the request of the State Board of Education, elect to provide the administration in the proposal, funding could be requested though the budget process.

Officials from the **Poplar Bluff School District** responded, but did not indicate a fiscal impact, if any.
