FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Health and Senior Services** and the **Department of Insurance**, **Financial Institutions & Professional Registration** each assume the proposal would have no fiscal impact on their respective agencies.

Officials from the **Department of Mental Health** assume the proposal would not create a fiscal impact because none of the DMH facilities are licensed by the Department of Health and Senior Services.

Officials from the **Department of Social Services** state this proposal establishes the "Uninsured Patients Protection Act" in Section 197, RSMo. This legislation prohibits hospitals from charging uninsured patients more than the current Medicare reimbursement rate for services provided. An uninsured person is a resident of the state who does not have access to affordable employer-subsidized health care insurance or other health care coverage. A person who is eligible for medical assistance as authorized in Section 208.151, RSMo, is not uninsured for the purposes of this section.

Since this section does not affect individuals who are Medicaid eligible under Section 208.151, RSMo, there will be no fiscal impact to the Division of Medical Services.

Officials from the Barton County Hospital, Bates County Memorial Hospital, Cedar County Memorial Hospital, Cooper County Hospital, Excelsior Springs Medical Center, Putnam County Memorial Hospital and the Washington County Memorial Hospital have not responded to Oversight's request for fiscal information.
