FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Public Safety - Missouri Highway Patrol (MHP)** state their Training Division does not have any qualified instructors to teach federal immigration laws. MHP therefore assumes that the Academy will host the training and provide classroom space, as well as lodging and meals. The cost for this would be \$55 per day. The proposed legislation does not state how much training would be required and who would provide the training. It is therefore not possible to determine the actual fiscal impact. The MHP assumes an unknown cost to the Highway Fund as a result of this proposal.

In response to a similar proposal from 2006 (HCS for SCS for SB 1250), the MHP assumed no fiscal impact from the proposal. **Oversight** assumes the cost associated with training some of the MHP would be able to be absorbed within existing appropriations. Oversight also assumes there could be material costs to the MHP if the superintendent designates that all members of the MHP shall receive the training; however, Oversight will assume only a portion of MHP members would receive the training.

Officials from the **Office of the Governor** assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their agency.
