FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the Office of State Courts Administrator, Department of Economic Development (DED) - Office of Public Council, DED - Public Service Commission, Department of Natural Resources, Missouri Department of Conservation, and City of Kansas City assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organizations.

Officials from the **City of Centralia** assume the proposal would have no impact on their organization. However, officials assume "lines" still mean transmission and distribution lines. If the proposal is intended to include customer service lines, the cost is not calculable (probably in the high tens of thousands of dollars per year) as it would require utilities to trim trees on property anywhere near a service line, whether in the easement, or not.

Officials from the **City of West Plains** assume the proposal would have a small, insignificant positive fiscal impact by reducing power outages. However, it depends on the outage and how extensive the outage.
