#### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### **ASSUMPTION**

Officials from the Office of State Courts Administrator, Department of Economic Development (DED) - Office of Public Council, DED - Public Service Commission, and Department of Natural Resources assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organizations.

Officials from the **Office of Secretary of State (SOS)** state the fiscal impact for this proposal is less than \$2,500. The SOS does not expect that additional funding would be required to meet these costs. However, the SOS also recognizes that many such bills may be passed by the General Assembly in a given year and that collectively the costs may be in excess of what the SOS can sustain within its core budget. Therefore, the SOS reserves the right to request funding for the costs of supporting administrative rules requirements should the need arise based on a review of the finally approved bills signed by the Governor.

Officials from the **Office of Attorney General** did not respond to our request for a statement of fiscal impact. However, in response to an earlier version of this proposal, the AGO assumed the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization.

Officials from **Office of Prosecution Services** and **Independence Power and Light** did not respond to our request for a statement of fiscal impact.
