FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

The **Joint Committee on Public Employee Retirement (JCPER)** has reviewed this proposal and has determined an actuarial study is not needed under the provisions of section 105.660, subdivision (5).

Officials from the **Missouri State Employees' Retirement (MOSERS)** assume this proposal would involve minor modifications to and clarifications of the Missouri State Employees' Plan (MSEP), and the MoDOT and Patrol Employees' Retirement system (MPERS). These provisions are commonly referred to by the retirement systems as "clean-up" legislation. They are general in nature and carry no fiscal impact to the systems.

Officials from the Missouri Consolidated Health Care Plan, Department of Labor, Department of Conservation, MoDOT and Patrol Employees' Retirement System and Office of Administration - Division of Budget & Planning assume no fiscal impact to their agencies.
