FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Economic Development - Public Service Commission** state this proposal will have no fiscal impact on their agency.

According to officials from the **Department of Social Services - Family Support Division (FSD)** would be required to establish a financial planning or budget class for elderly, disabled and individual households who are eligible under the Federal Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP), also labeled Utilicare for the state of Missouri, before assistance is awarded.

Currently, FSD contracts with the 19 Community Action Agencies that provide services statewide. FSD administers three programs within the LIHEAP year (October through September): Energy Assistance (regular heating program), Winter Energy Crisis Intervention Program and Summer Energy Crisis Intervention Program. There were estimated over 144,967 unduplicated households assisted in the FY06 program year for these three areas. Each contracted agency would be required to administer the financial planning course for each head of household who would qualify before any assistance payment can be made to the energy provider.

FY 06, number of households that were assisted:

FSD assumes 80% of ECIP households are duplicates of the EA households to equal 144,967 unduplicated households assisted in FY06 program period. In spending projections for the program, FSD has estimated a 10% increase (14,497 each year) in households assisted for each year:

<u>ASSUMPTION</u> (continued)

The 19 Missouri Community Action Agencies (CAA) provide other services for the community. Most provide some type of life skill course that would include budgeting or financial planning. CAAs bill for these classes based upon hours provided and number of individuals served. The average cost per hour is \$25 with the average length of a budget/financial planning course being 4 hours long (averages based upon information received by FSD). Cost of the required course for each head of household would equal \$100:
