FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Insurance**, **Finance**, **and Professional Regulation** state this proposal will have no fiscal impact on their agency.

Officials from the **Department of Health and Senior Services (DHSS)**, that the existing DHSS staff are available to work with the Missouri State Medical Association and the Missouri Osteopathic Association to develop a standardized physical examination form, which would be used during the examination of second and eighth grade students. DHSS would post the form on it's web site to make it easily available to individuals and the medical community.

According to officials from the **Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DES)**, fall enrollment for students in 2nd grade and 8th grade for the 2004-2005 school year was 65,265 and 73,419 respectively. DES assumes this proposal will result in unknown administrative costs to local school districts for tracking the physical examinations, corresponding with doctors and parents, and retaining necessary records. DES cannot determine the fiscal impact, but assume it will be significant.

Oversight assumes school districts would be able to do the required tracking with existing resources.
