FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials at the **Department of Labor and Industrial Relations** assume that the number of individuals that would be affected by this provision would be small; however the Department is unable to determine the actual number of individuals who would be discharged under these circumstances.

Based upon an average weekly benefit amount (\$209.79) and the average claim duration (14.5 weeks), each claim would potentially result in \$3,041.96 in unemployment benefits being paid from the Unemployment Compensation Trust Fund. For each claimant that would be disqualified for receiving waiting week credit and benefits, it is assumed \$3,041.96 would be saved.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

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FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This bill specifies that a worker discharged for providing false information on an application for employment concerning criminal convictions or qualification for a position will be deemed to have been discharged for misconduct and disqualified for the waiting week credit and benefits provided in the unemployment compensation laws.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
