FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Higher Education**, **Department of Social Services** - **Children's Division** and the **Department of Social Services** - **Family Support Division** each assume the proposal would have no fiscal impact on their respective agencies.

Officials from the **Department of Social Services - Division of Medical Services (DMS)** assumes no fiscal impact to the DMS. Currently, the Children's Division (CD) can retain custody of an individual until he/she reaches the age of 21. A child who is in the custody of the CD is eligible to receive Medicaid.

However, the annual cost to provided medical assistance to children (up to age 21) currently in foster care on their 18th birthday who later become independent as defined in 42 U.S.C. 1396d or 42 U.S.C. 1396a (a)(10)(A)(ii)(XVII), is \$1.7 million.

Officials from the **Department of Mental Health** assume no fiscal impact to their agency because currently the Children's Division (CD) can retain custody of a child until he/she reaches the age of 21. Children in custody of the CD are eligible to receive Medicaid.
