## AN ACT

Disapproving the amount of increase in compensation for public officials as recommended by the Missouri Citizen's Commission on Compensation for Elected Officials.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Whereas, Article XIII, Section 3 of the Missouri Constitution charges the Missouri Citizen's Commission on Compensation for Elected Officials with setting the amounts of compensation 3 paid to statewide elected officials, legislators, and judges; and 4 Whereas, the Constitution provides the Commission with a four-month window prior to 5 its constitutional deadline for making salary recommendations to hold public hearings around the state 7 to gather testimony related to salaries for affected state officials and to carefully consider whether pay 8 increases are warranted; and 9 Whereas, in 2006, the Commission did not begin work until eleven days before its 10 December 1, 2006, deadline for submitting a report containing salary recommendations; and 11 12 Whereas, as few as six members of the twenty-two member Commission attended the 13 public hearings at which testimony on salaries for affected officials was given; and 14 15 Whereas, the Commission recommended pay increases for state judges and statewide 16 17 elected officials effective July 1, 2007, and pay increases for legislators effective January 1, 2009; and 18  $\mathbf{W}\mathbf{hereas}$ , the Commission's recommendations shall take effect unless disapproved by the 19 20 General Assembly through a concurrent resolution process passed by two-thirds majorities in each

legislative chamber before February 1, 2007:

Now, therefore, be it resolved by the members of the House of Representatives of the Ninety-fourth General Assembly, First Regular Session, the Senate concurring therein, that the
