AN ACT

To amend chapter 194, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to the release of a decedent's information, records, and documents.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 194, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new section, to be 2 known as section 194.205, to read as follows:

194.205. 1. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, any of the 2 following persons, in order of priority stated and in the absence of actual notice of contrary 3 indications by the decedent or of opposition by a member of the same or a prior class, shall 4 have the same rights and responsibilities as a legally appointed personal representative of the decedent, and shall have access to and may authorize the release of any and all 5 information, records, and documents regarding the decedent: 6 7 (1) An attorney-in-fact under a durable power of attorney that expressly refers to the release of any or all information, records, and documents regarding the decedent; 8 9 (2) The spouse;

10 (3) An adult son or daughter;

- 11 (4) Either parent;
- 12 (5) An adult brother or sister;
- 13 (6) A guardian of the person of the decedent at the time of the decedent's death;
- 14 (7) Any other person authorized or under obligation to dispose of the body.

EXPLANATION — Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted from the law. Matter in **bold-face** type in the above bill is proposed language.
