Whereas, Hurricane Katrina damaged over 200,000 Gulf Coast homes; and

3	Whereas, Hurricane Katrina destroyed schools, hospitals, roads, community
4	centers, bridges, parks, and forest lands; and

6	Whereas, the federal government's response to this unprecedented disaster has
7	been ineffective and weak; and
8	
9	Whereas, the evacuation process, deaths, injuries, and aftermath of Hurricane
10	Katrina dramatically emphasize disparities of race and income that are yet to be eradicated in the
11	United States; and
12	
13	Whereas, 101,000 Louisianans have applied for aid to rebuild their homes, and
14	only 257 people have received grants; and
15	
16	Whereas, during the Great Depression, when the United States faced a crisis, our
17	country created 800,000 jobs in two weeks, and more than three million jobs in two months
18	through the Works Project Administration; and

20	Whereas, the public workers during the Great Depression built or repaired 2,500
21	hospitals, 6,000 schools, 13,000 playgrounds, and even built the Golden Gate Bridge; and

	Whereas, a WPA-like project for the Gulf Coast could rebuild homes and shattered
2	lives, and restore faith in our federal government; and

4	Whereas, the rebuilding of the Gulf Coast is not a Democrat or Republican issue,
5	but an American issue:

7	Now, therefore, be it resolved that the members of the House of
8	Representatives of the Ninety-fourth General Assembly, First Regular Session, the Senate
9	concurring therein, hereby urge, on behalf of its citizens, the passage of federal legislation based
10	on the Gulf Coast Civic Works Project, a national effort to create 100,000 jobs for Gulf Coast
11	residents to rebuild their communities; and

13	Be it further resolved that the Chief Clerk of the Missouri House of
14	Representatives be instructed to prepare properly inscribed copies of this resolution for George
15	W. Bush, President of the United States, and each member of the Missouri Congressional

Delegation.
