## AN ACT

To amend chapter 301, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to special license plates for persons convicted of driving while intoxicated.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 301, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new section, to be 2 known as section 301.3157, to read as follows:

301.3157. 1. Owners of motor vehicles who have been found guilty of or who have pled guilty to driving while intoxicated under section 577.028, RSMo, shall be issued a set 2 of DWI license plates to be placed on each motor vehicle such person owns, either solely 3 or jointly, other than an apportioned motor vehicle or a commercial motor vehicle licensed 4 in excess of eighteen thousand pounds gross weight. The plates issued under this section 5 shall be displayed on such person's motor vehicle or vehicles for a period of one year 6 following the conviction for the intoxication-related offense. 7 8 2. The license plates shall be a color designated by the department of revenue that 9 is easily distinguishable from other license plates issued in this state. Upon such set of licensed plates shall be inscribed, in lieu of the words "SHOW-ME STATE", the word 10

- 11 "DWI". Such license plates shall be made with fully reflective material and shall be clearly
- 12 visible at night.

EXPLANATION — Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted from the law. Matter in **bold-face** type in the above bill is proposed language.

3. An additional annual fee equal to that charged for personalized license plates in
section 301.144 shall be paid to the director of revenue for the issuance of the license plates
provided for in this section.

16 4. The department of revenue shall promulgate rules as necessary to effectuate 17 compliance with this section. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in 18 section 536.010, RSMo, that is created under the authority delegated in this section shall 19 become effective only if it complies with and is subject to all of the provisions of chapter 20 536, RSMo, and, if applicable, section 536.028, RSMo. This section and chapter 536, 21 RSMo, are nonseverable and if any of the powers vested with the general assembly 22 pursuant to chapter 536, RSMo, to review, to delay the effective date, or to disapprove and 23 annul a rule are subsequently held unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking 24 authority and any rule proposed or adopted after August 28, 2007, shall be invalid and 25 void.
